

My family puts money on the phone when they can but the oppressive rates are a heavy burden to maintain.

Moreover, when I do manage to utilize G.T.L's services the quality of connection is very poor and often times is a blatant waste of money. For instance, calls are routinely prematurely dropped and neither party can hear each other. In these harsh financial times every dollar matters.

I ask that you consider the facts. The customers of Global Tel Link are dissatisfied with their services and request fair and adequate treatment.
