7.1 GENERAL

Reciprocal Compensation Arrangements are available to Other Network Providers ("ONP's") who are also certified providers of local exchange service. Under a Reciprocal Compensation Arrangement, the Company compensates the ONP for Company traffic terminating on the ONP's network and the ONP compensates the Company for ONP traffic terminating on the Company's network.

The Carrier Common Line element shall not apply to Reciprocal Compensation Arrangements.

The Local Switching element shall apply to Reciprocal Compensation Arrangements.

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7.2 MEASUREMENT OF ACCESS MINUTES AND DETERMINATION OF BALANCE

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SECTION 5. LOCAL TRAFFIC EXCHANGE AND TERMINATION

5.1 General

This section establishes the methodology for the exchange and termination of local traffic for carriers that do not have an interconnection agreement with the Company.

5.2 Ordering Conditions

The Customer may order switched access through a Constructive Order, as defined herein, or through an ASR. The format and terms of the ASR will be as specified in the Industry Access Service Order Guidelines, unless otherwise specified herein.

5.3 Reciprocal Compensation

Reciprocal Compensation shall not apply to: Interstate or intrastate exchange access; Internet traffic, Toll traffic, including calls originated on a 1+ presubscription basis, or casual dialed 10XXX/10XXXX basis; Optional Extended Area Service traffic; Tandem Transit Traffic; or traffic that is not subject to Reciprocal Compensation under Section 251(b)(5) of the 1996 Telecommunications Act. The Carrier Common Line element shall not apply to Reciprocal Compensation Arrangements. The Local Switching element shall apply to Reciprocal Compensation Arrangements.

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
