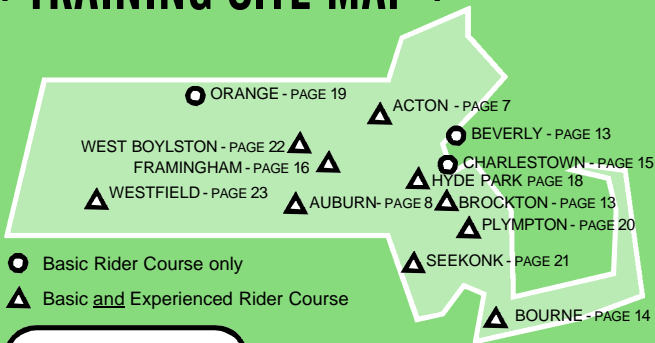

The Massachusetts Rider Education Program (MREP)

ABOUT THE PROGRAM **1**

To minimize the risk and maximize the fun of motorcycling, the Registry of Motor Vehicles sponsors the Massachusetts Rider Education Program (MREP). The mission of this program is to reduce the number of motorcycle related fatalities and injuries in the Commonwealth through increasing the statewide availability of Motorcycle Safety Foundation (MSF) approved training courses for motorcycle riders and to increase awareness and education for both riders and other drivers.

In keeping with its mission statement, the MREP has provided training motorcycles and/or promotional and technical assistance to a statewide network of training sites. All RiderCoaches that teach these motorcycle safety courses are MSF certified with additional MREP approval.

Since its inception in 1990, the MREP program has trained more than 78,000 students (over 7,800 in 2006 alone). There were also 500 students that went through the Experienced Rider Course. In 2006, Massachusetts had over 167,000 active motorcycle registrations and over 301,000 active licensed motorcyclists. There were 48 motorcycle fatalities as of Dec 2006.

Funding comes from Massachusetts General Law, Chapter 90, Section 34: "...\$2.00 from each motorcycle registration fee shall be paid by the Registrar or by the person collecting the registration fee into the general fund and shall be appropriated solely for the purpose of promoting and advancing motorcycle safety." The Governor's Highway Safety Bureau (GHSB) also maintains Motorcycle Safety Federal Grant monies. These federal grant monies must meet National Highway Safety Administration policies and guidelines.

Qualified graduates of either the Basic Rider Course or the Experienced Rider Course Suite - License Waiver Course are exempt from the Registry of Motor Vehicles' motorcycle license road test (and related \$20 appointment fee), which is otherwise required to obtain a motorcycle license or endorsement. See page 4 for more details. Students under 18 years of age must contact the site coordinator for further information on their eligibility for the RMV road test exemption prior to registering for a course.



✔ *Save 10% on your Motorcycle Insurance!*

Graduates of the Basic Rider Course and the Experienced Rider Course Suite - License Waiver Course receive an MSF course completion card that entitles them to a limited 10% discount on their Massachusetts-based motorcycle insurance.

BASIC RIDER COURSE

This is an approximately 15-hour course (5 hours classroom, 10 hours riding). It costs \$249 to \$389, depending on the MREP site. Some MREP sites offer a lower tuition for students under 21 years of age. Training motorcycles (250 cc or less) and course books are provided to students. A limited number of loaner helmets are available for students without one.

CLASSROOM SESSIONS COVER:

- The challenge of motorcycling
- Motorcycle controls
- Rider and motorcycle preparation
- Basic riding skills
- Street strategies
- Advanced turning and braking techniques
- Special riding situations
- Dangers of impaired riding

ON-CYCLE SESSIONS COVER:

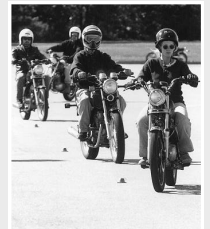
- Straight-line riding, turning, shifting, and stopping
- Advanced turning and braking techniques
- Crash avoidance maneuvers

Students must attend all on-cycle and discussion sessions and pass both a multiple choice knowledge test and a riding skill evaluation to graduate from this course and to receive a course completion card.

Statewide, approximately 93% of students successfully complete this course their first time. Please understand this course has a group learning format that limits the ability of instructors to provide individual instruction to students. This course is also mentally and physically demanding. Weather conditions can increase the stress on students. Please review the Course Requirements section to learn about other course limitations.

RIDER TIP

Get Licensed... First, get a motorcycle learner's permit by passing a knowledge test based on the Motorcycle Manual and Driver's Manual, which is available at the Registry. This test may be taken without an appointment at any full-service Registry office. Next, pass one of the MREP's courses or the Registry's road test to earn your motorcycle license or endorsement. 4 DESCRIPTIONS

EXPERIENCED RIDER COURSE (ERC) SUITE

The ERC Suite is an approximately 7-hour course. The course costs between \$100 - \$150.00, depending on which site you choose. Students must use their own motorcycle, which must be properly insured, registered, inspected, and must pass the Rider Coach's pre-ride check. A copy of the pre-ride checklist will be mailed to the student.

THE ERC SUITE CONSISTS OF 3 COURSES

- Skills Practice Rider Course
- License Waiver Rider Course
- Skills Plus Rider Course

ERC SUITE SKILLS PRACTICE

This course is designed for riders who have successfully completed the BRC or who possess basic operational skills. No knowledge test or skill evaluation is conducted. Completion cards are not issued.

ERC SUITE LICENSE WAIVER RIDER COURSE

This course is designed for riders who do not yet possess a state motorcycle license or endorsement and/or want the limited 10 percent insurance discount. Students must attend all on-cycle and discussion sessions and pass both a written test and a riding skill evaluation to graduate from this course and to receive a completion card.

ERC SUITE SKILLS PLUS

This course is designed for riders who are already licensed and frequently ride. The knowledge test and skill evaluation are optional. Passengers may participate (but not during the skill evaluation). Completion cards are not issued.

ON RANGE DISCUSSIONS COVER:

- Rider and motorcycle preparation
- Advanced street riding strategies
- Traction Management
- Advanced braking, cornering, and swerving techniques
- The dangers of impaired riding

ON CYCLE SESSIONS COVER:

- A review of basic skills
- Advanced braking, cornering, and swerving techniques

Students must attend all on-cycle and discussion sessions, and must pass both the knowledge test and the skill evaluation in order to receive a course completion card.

DESCRIPTIONS 5

Statewide, approximately 95% of students successfully complete this course their first time. Please understand this course has a group-learning format that limits the ability of the Rider Coach to provide individual instructions to students. This course is also mentally and physically demanding. Weather conditions can increase the stress on students. Please review the Course Requirements section to learn about other course limitations.

YOU MUST BRING THE FOLLOWING TO EITHER COURSE:

- Valid Massachusetts motorcycle learner's permit or a valid motorcycle license from any state
 - **Clear photocopy of learner's permit, if seeking the RMV road test exemption. See Course Requirements on page 6 for more details**
 - Pencil or pen for note taking (BRC only)
- Students under 18 years of age will need to present a parental permission form at the first class session (this form will be sent to you before class)**

YOU MUST BRING TO THE RIDING SESSIONS OF EITHER COURSE:

- DOT-approved helmet and eye protection (face shield, eyeglasses, or sunglasses)
- Long sleeve shirt or jacket and long pants
- Sturdy, over-the-ankle footwear
- Full-finger leather gloves
- Rain gear (both courses run rain or shine) and sunblock
- Snack/lunch and non-alcoholic beverages

RIDER TIP



Wear Protective Riding Gear... State law requires motorcyclists and their passengers (also moped riders) to wear a helmet that meets the current Dept. of Transportation's (DOT) safety standard. State law also requires motorcyclists and their passengers to have eye protection. To better protect yourself from the elements and the road, wear a long sleeve shirt or jacket, long pants, over-the-ankle footwear, and full-finger gloves.

RIDER TIP



Ride Straight... A first-time Driving Under the Influence (DUI) conviction in Massachusetts is punishable with up to 2½ years in jail, license suspension, and fines up to \$5,000. State law uses a 0.08 Blood Alcohol Content standard for adults and a 0.02 standard for those under 21. By riding free of drugs and alcohol, you avoid unnecessary risks and the expense of a DUI conviction.

Course Requirements

6 REQUIREMENTS

Please read this section prior to signing Part 5 of the Registration Form in this brochure.

- Students seeking exemption from an RMV motorcycle road test (and the \$20 test fee) must do the following:
 - Obtain a Massachusetts motorcycle learner's permit PRIOR to the first session of a course. This permit must not expire for at least two weeks following the class completion date.
 - Pre-pay the required \$15 motorcycle endorsement fee or the \$40 motorcycle license fee before the first class session. You can pay at any RMV branch by cash, check, credit card, or money order. Or you can call 617-351-4500 (from the 617 or 781 area codes) or 1-800-858-3926 (from all other area codes) and pay by credit card.
 - Include a photocopy of your learner's permit when you submit a registration form to a site coordinator OR bring a photocopy of your learner's permit to the first session.
 - After completing the course, continue to operate under the restrictions of your learner's permit until you receive your new license in the mail.
 - If you are under 18 years of age, you must contact the site coordinator for further information on your eligibility for the RMV road test exemption prior to registering for a course.
- Both the Basic and Experienced Rider Courses involve the risk of personal injury. Students unable to maintain pace, for any reason, of either course or who pose a hazard to themselves or others may be dismissed by the instructor.
- Students are covered by a limited medical and liability insurance policy during their participation in a course, but they may wish to review and add to their existing vehicle and medical insurance.
- Students registering for the Basic Rider Course must at a minimum be able to ride and balance a bicycle.
- Motorcycles used in the Experienced Rider Course must pass a pre-ride inspection given by the instructors.
- **Cancellation Policy:** To receive a refund, a request must be sent in writing (US Mail, e-mail, or fax) and received by the site coordinator more than 10 days prior to the start of the course. All cancellations that are made more than 10 days prior to the start of the course will be charged a \$25 cancellation fee. No refunds will be made to students who cancel with less than 10 days written notice, are late to class, dismissed, voluntarily leave, do not pass a written or riding evaluation, have previously rescheduled, or miss a segment of either course.
- **Reschedule Policy:** Students may reschedule to another class within the calendar year one time, space permitting. All reschedule requests must be sent to the site coordinator in writing (US Mail, e-mail, or fax). All reschedule requests that are received by the site coordinator more than 5 days prior to the start of the course will be charged a \$25 reschedule fee. All reschedule requests that are received by the site coordinator within 5 days of the class will be charged a \$100 reschedule fee.
- Classes may be canceled with no notice due to inclement weather, an inability to access necessary facilities, or other unforeseen problems. Students will receive a full refund in such rare cases. It will be each student's responsibility to schedule a new class date with the site coordinator.
- Students may retake the riding skill evaluation only once for any one class. Students who must return to the training site for their second riding skill evaluation must do so within 14 days of the class completion date on a space-available basis. All such retakes will be subject to a \$25 charge.
- Every effort is made to present the most accurate, error free, and up-to-date information. However, policies, schedules, and fees change from time to time.
