Bay State lottery players, rejoice — a hot new game is coming to town.

“I’ve been waiting for this game since I arrived,” state Treasurer Deborah B. Goldberg said yesterday of the new All or Nothing game, which is expected to be rolled out by mid-July.

Goldberg’s comments came as Massachusetts State Lottery Commission members voted to replace their under-performing Jackpot Poker contest with All or Nothing — a monitor game that will dish out big cash prizes to players who match either all or none of the 12 numbers drawn.

Similar to Keno, winning All or Nothing numbers will be drawn about every four minutes, seven days a week, between 10 a.m. and 1 a.m.

Players wagering either \$1, \$2, \$5 or \$10 per game will select 12 numbers between 1 and 24 and then a computer program will randomly select the winning combination and display it on an All or Nothing monitor.

There’s also a bonus option, which gives a player the chance to increase their winnings by 3, 4, 5 or even 10 times. And the All or Nothing-To-Go option allows players to participate in up to 30 consecutive games — meaning they can leave the monitor behind and check online to see how they fared.
