The Changing Demographics of Family Caregivers

This *Forbes* article describes the changing demographics of family caregivers – more are men, more are younger, and many are caring for someone who is under the age of 65. While 8 out of 10 say caregiving affects them positively, more than half cite that it also has a negative consequence on their well-being.

Governor's Council to Address Aging in Massachusetts Publishes Updated Blueprint Recommendations

On December 10, the Governor's Council to Address Aging in Massachusetts met to **finalize 28 blueprint recommendations**. Read the spotlight on page two to find out how these recommendations will impact family caregivers.

AARP Announces 2018 State Capitol Caregivers and Super Savers

AARP recognizes **state legislators**, **governors**, **and other elected officials** who have advanced policies that help older Americans remain in their communities, support family caregivers, and assist people to retire with confidence. AARP's fifth annual class of **Capital Caregivers** and fourth annual class of **Super Savers** is now available.

On US Workers' Wish Lists for 2019: Help with Caregiving, Finances

A series of 2018 polls measured workforce sentiment on finances, caregiving, and employee benefits. Help with caregiving and finances were the top two issues on US workers' wish lists for 2019. In general, workers are most interested in benefits that align with family caregiving needs and support flexibility.

Family Caregiver Alliance Research Registry

The Family Caregiver Alliance's research registry includes a **current list of open studies being conducted by professionals and graduate students**. Many of the study investigators are seeking family caregivers to participate through online or telephone input for small increments of time.

Governor's Council to Address Aging in Massachusetts Publishes Updated Blueprint of Recommendations



This December, the Governor's Council to Address Aging in Massachusetts, co-chaired by Secretary Marylou Sudders and Eileen Connors, submitted 28 recommendations to Governor Baker, including two directly related to caregiving.

The updated blueprint's caregiving recommendations focus on solutions and tools to support caregivers where they are aggregated, with an initial focus on the workplace. Recommendation 1 includes partnerships with employers to strengthen their support of family caregivers. Recommendation 11 focuses on the broader population of caregivers with the goal of improving self-identification and increasing awareness of resources. This includes the updated Mass.gov content featured in November's newsletter.

In addition to the two specific recommendations, caregiving was included as a part of the In Good Company Optimal Aging Challenge, which focused on social isolation and loneliness and launched as part of the Council's work. The Challenge announced four winners in December – many of these innovations may be useful for family caregivers!

It is a "support group for support group facilitators". The Commission schedules five meetings a year in different locations throughout the state.

2019 Global Carework Summit

(June 9-11, Toronto, Ontario)

The Carework Network, an international organization of scholars and advocates, is organizing its second three-day conference to bring together researchers from across disciplines and across the globe. Conference topics are broad and include how identities and inequalities influence caregiving, how caregiving is recognized and compensated, and how state policies influence the distribution of care.

ASA Webinar Series for Caregivers

Year round, the American Society on Aging and Home Instead Senior Care offer monthly webinars for family caregivers. These webinars are free, and recordings are available for 60 days afterwards. The next webinar on **Navigating Long-Term Care Insurance** is scheduled for **January 9**, with other topics such as **Caregiving along the Care Continuum** and **Hospital to Home** in the first quarter of 2019.
