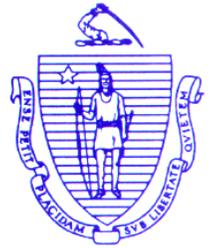

2018 COMMERCIAL BLACK SEA BASS FISHERY TO CLOSE EFFECTIVE MONDAY, SEPTEMBER 10, 2018

Massachusetts' 2018 commercial black sea bass quota of 457,645 pounds is projected to be taken on Sunday, September 9, 2018. Accordingly, the Massachusetts commercial black sea bass fishery will be closed effective Monday, September 10, 2018 ([Closure Notice](#)). The fishery will remain closed until 2019. During the closed period, it is unlawful for fishermen to possess and land black sea bass for commercial purposes or in a manner that does not conform to the state's recreational fishing regulations. Additionally, it is unlawful for seafood dealers to purchase or receive black sea bass from fishermen.

Commercial fishermen are to submit monthly trip-level reports by the fifteenth of the following month, even if their permit was not fished. Reports should be sent to DMF Statistics Project, 30 Emerson Avenue, Gloucester, MA 01930. Failure to submit these reports for all months of the year in a timely manner may result in the non-renewal of a commercial permit and its endorsements in 2019. Blank forms and instructions were mailed out prior to the beginning of the 2018 fishing season; additional copies can be obtained on the [Trip Level Reporting website](#).
