

EFFECTIVE SEPTEMBER 6TH COMMERCIAL LIMITED ACCESS MENHADEN FISHERY TRIP LIMIT REDUCED TO 6,000 POUNDS

The Division of Marine Fisheries has determined that 95% of the state's 2019 commercial menhaden quota will be landed by Thursday, September 5, 2019. Accordingly, the Director of the Division of Marine Fisheries has declared that the commercial limited access menhaden trip limit will be reduced from 25,000 pounds to 6,000 pounds, effective at 0001 hours on Friday, September 6, 2019 ([Declaration Notice](#)). This trip limit shall apply to any commercial fisherman fishing for menhaden.

This 6,000-pound trip limit will remain in effect until 100% of the 2019 commercial quota is taken, at which time a 1,000-pound bycatch allowance will be implemented. This bycatch allowance authorizes any commercial fisherman to possess and land up to 1,000 pounds of menhaden per trip, provided the weight of menhaden does not exceed 5% the overall weight of the catch; seines may not exceed 150 fathoms length or 8 fathoms depth. Menhaden trip limits are possession and landing limits and apply per calendar day or per trip, whichever period is longer.

The state's commercial quota for 2019 was set at 6,045,252 pounds. Based on this quota, DMF initially reduced the limited entry fishery's trip limit from 25,000 pounds to 6,000 pounds on August 16. However, following this action, DMF obtained a quota transfer of 500,000 pounds from Connecticut and Rhode Island. This increased the state's quota to 6,545,252 pounds resulting in landings being below the 95% revised quota. This enabled DMF to re-open the fishery at the 25,000 pound limit on August 22 and maintain that trip limit through September 5.

Commercial fishermen are to submit monthly trip-level reports by the fifteenth of the following month, even if their permit is not fished. Reports should be sent to DMF Statistics Project, 30 Emerson Avenue, Gloucester, MA 01930. Failure to submit these reports for all months of the year in a timely manner may result in the non-renewal of a commercial permit and its endorsements in 2020. Blank forms and instructions were mailed out prior to the beginning of the 2019 fishing season; additional copies can be obtained on the [Trip Level Reporting website](#).
