Procedural History

This matter came before the State Building Code Appeals Board ("Board") on the Appellant's appeal filed pursuant to 780 CMR 122.1. In accordance with 780 CMR 122.3, the Appellant requested that the Board grant a variance to 7th edition 780 CMR 1604.10, for the property at 55 Conant Avenue, Danvers, MA. In accordance with GL c. 30A, §§10 & 11; GL c. 143, §100; 801 CMR 1.02 et. seq.; and 780 CMR 122.3.4, the Board convened a public hearing on August 6, 2009 where all interested parties were provided with an opportunity to testify and present evidence to the Board. Greg Salhofen, Richard Maloney, and others appeared and testified at this hearing.

Discussion

Based on the testimony presented, a motion was made to grant the Appellant's request for a variance to 7th edition 780 CMR 1604.10 for two lights poles that were designed to wind load requirements of the 6th edition. The motion was made based on the fact that the original design was based on the 6th edition and that project schedule delays were out of the appellant's control. There was a second on the motion and a board vote was taken, which was unanimous.

Conclusion

The Appellant's request for a variance to 7th edition 780 CMR 1604.10, is hereby granted as described in the discussion above and so ordered on this date: August 6, 2009.
