Herring Management Area 1A Period 4 Measures

The Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission's Atlantic Herring Section adopted days-out measures for Period 4 (November 1 – December 31) Atlantic Sea Herring Fishery in Management Area 1A.

Beginning on November 4, 2019, all Massachusetts commercial fishermen with a regulated fishery permit endorsement for sea herring are subject to a <u>Statement of Permit Conditions</u> from the Massachusetts Division of Marine Fisheries implementing the following approved measures for Period 4:

• <u>Fishing Days</u>. Vessels participating in the directed fishery for Atlantic sea herring may fish for and possess Atlantic sea herring taken from Management Area 1A seven days per week.



- <u>Landing Days</u>. Vessels participating in the directed fishery for Atlantic sea herring may land Atlantic sea herring taken from Management Area 1A on Mondays.
- <u>Days Out</u>. Vessels participating in the directed fishery for Atlantic sea herring are prohibited from landing Atlantic sea herring taken from Management Area 1A in Massachusetts Tuesdays through Sundays.
- <u>Quota Closure</u>. The Period 4 quota allocation for Management Area 1A will be closely monitored. Once 92% of the Period 4 quota allocation for Management Area 1A is projected to be landed, or 95% of the stock-wide quota is projected to be landed, the directed fishery for Atlantic sea herring in Management Area 1A will be closed.
- <u>Incidental Catch Exemption</u>. Vessels may land up to 2,000 pounds of sea herring taken from Management Area 1A on any day-out of the fishery or once the fishery is subject to a quota closure, provided the vessel does not land more than once per day.
