RECENT IN-SEASON ADJUSTMENTS TO COMMERCIAL SUMMER FLOUNDER LIMITS AND HORSESHOE CRAB OPEN FISHING DAYS FOR MOBILE GEAR FISHERMEN

Per our prior <u>Advisory</u>, an in-season adjustment was made to the commercial summer flounder limits. Effective, October 4, the commercial trip limit was increased to 1,000 pounds and <u>Fridays</u> and <u>Saturdays were eliminated as closed fishing days</u>. With this action to add Fridays and <u>Saturdays as open fishing days</u>, DMF has received questions regarding whether the commercial retention of horseshoe crabs would also be allowed on these days. To reduce regulatory discarding, mobile gear fishermen may retain, possess, and land horseshoe crabs on Fridays and Saturdays that are caught incidentally while fishing for summer flounder (<u>Permit Conditions</u>). The existing horseshoe crab trip limits remain in effect. This allows limited entry permit holders to retain and land up to 300 crabs and open entry permit holders to retain and land 75 crabs.
