

Fact Sheet: MassHealth's Requested 1115 Demonstration Amendment Supports Health Equity and Universal Coverage

January 21, 2025

On January 21, 2025 the Healey-Driscoll Administration posted for public comment a proposal to amend Massachusetts' Section 1115 Demonstration ("1115 Demonstration"). The amendment proposes additional innovative flexibilities under the 1115 Demonstration that was approved on September 28, 2022.

The Massachusetts 1115 Demonstration, currently approved through December 31, 2027, has long supported the Commonwealth's commitment to universal health care coverage and has provided federal authority to test innovations in payment and care delivery.

MassHealth intends to request authority through this amendment to implement the following changes:

• Exempt CommonHealth Members from Estate Recovery

- The Massachusetts Legislature via Chapter 197 of the Massachusetts Acts of 2024 (H.5033), amended
 the estate recovery requirements in Mass. General Laws chapter 118E, Section 31 to prohibit estate
 recovery from individuals who received medical assistance under the CommonHealth program.
 Massachusetts is seeking 1115 waiver authority to implement this new policy related to MassHealth's
 estate recovery efforts.
- As a result of these estate recovery changes, MassHealth will waive all estate recovery requirements for all CommonHealth members as defined in MassHealth's 1115 Demonstration STC 5.6.

Public Comment Period:

EOHHS will accept comments on the proposed amendment through 5:00 p.m. on February 20, 2025. Written comments may be delivered by email or mail.
