Response: This statement is based on Dr. Selwyn's general knowledge and experience in the field of telecommunications regulation and, in particular, on his understanding of telephone numbering issues, having been involved in numerous area code relief and number resource optimization proceedings, including DTE 98-38 on behalf of the Attorney General.
