

Longitudinal Study of 122 Clients

- ***Discharged from 2 State Hospitals to Community Placements during 2002-2003***



Demographics

- 60% male (n=73), 40% female (n=49)
- The age range 19-71 years; median age of 42 years
- 80% White/non-Hispanic, 5% African American, 2% Asian, and 10% “Two or more Races,” “Other” and “Unknown”.

Demographics

- The Length of Stay (LOS) ranged from 3 months to 22 years with a mean of 4.2 years +/- 4.8 years.
- Discharges were fairly equally distributed from the facilities with 45% (n=55) from WbSH and 55% from MSH (n=57 inpatients and n=10 on-grounds residents).

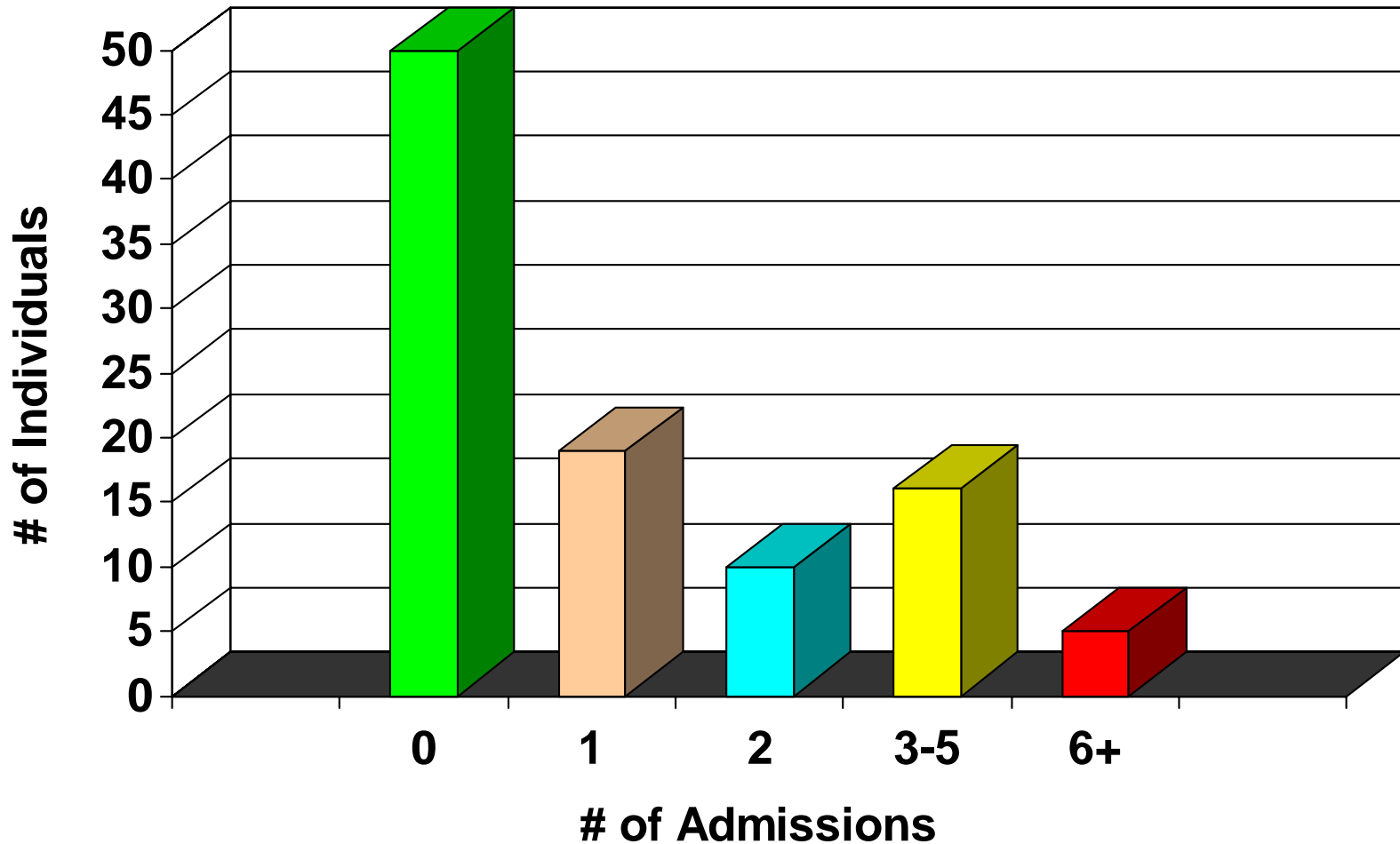

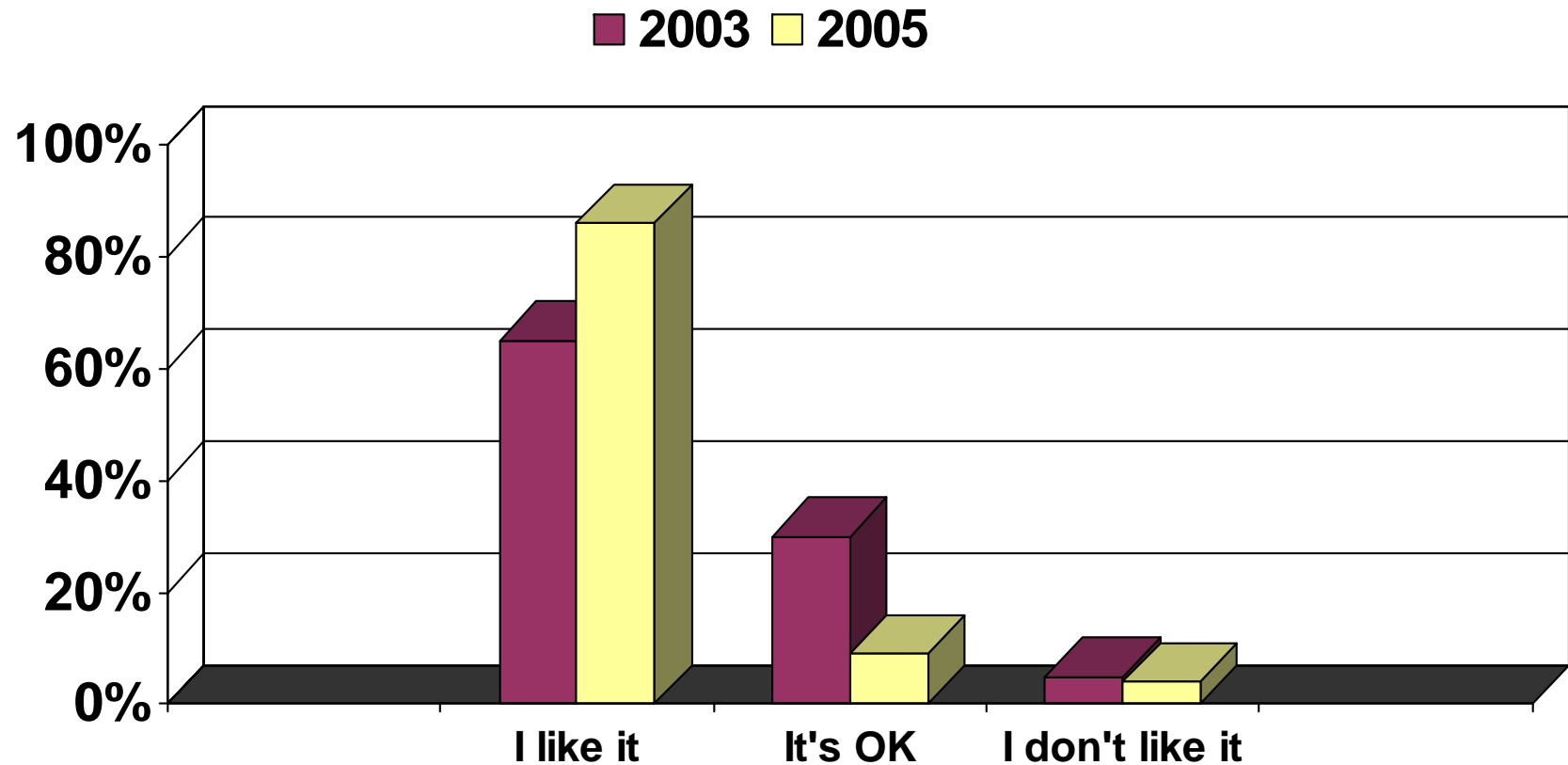

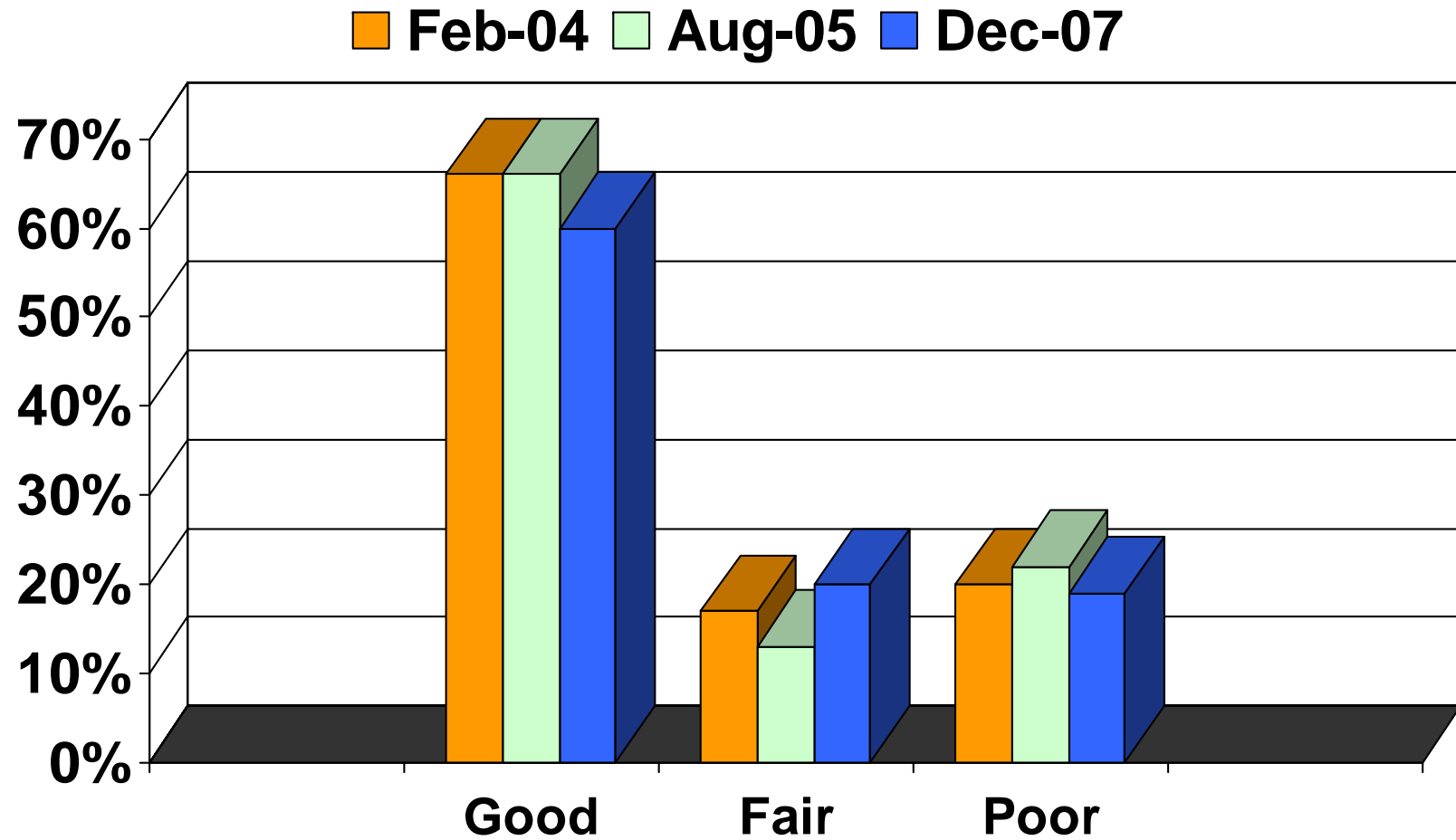
Acute Hospitalizations per Individual as of 12/31/07



How do you feel about living in the community?

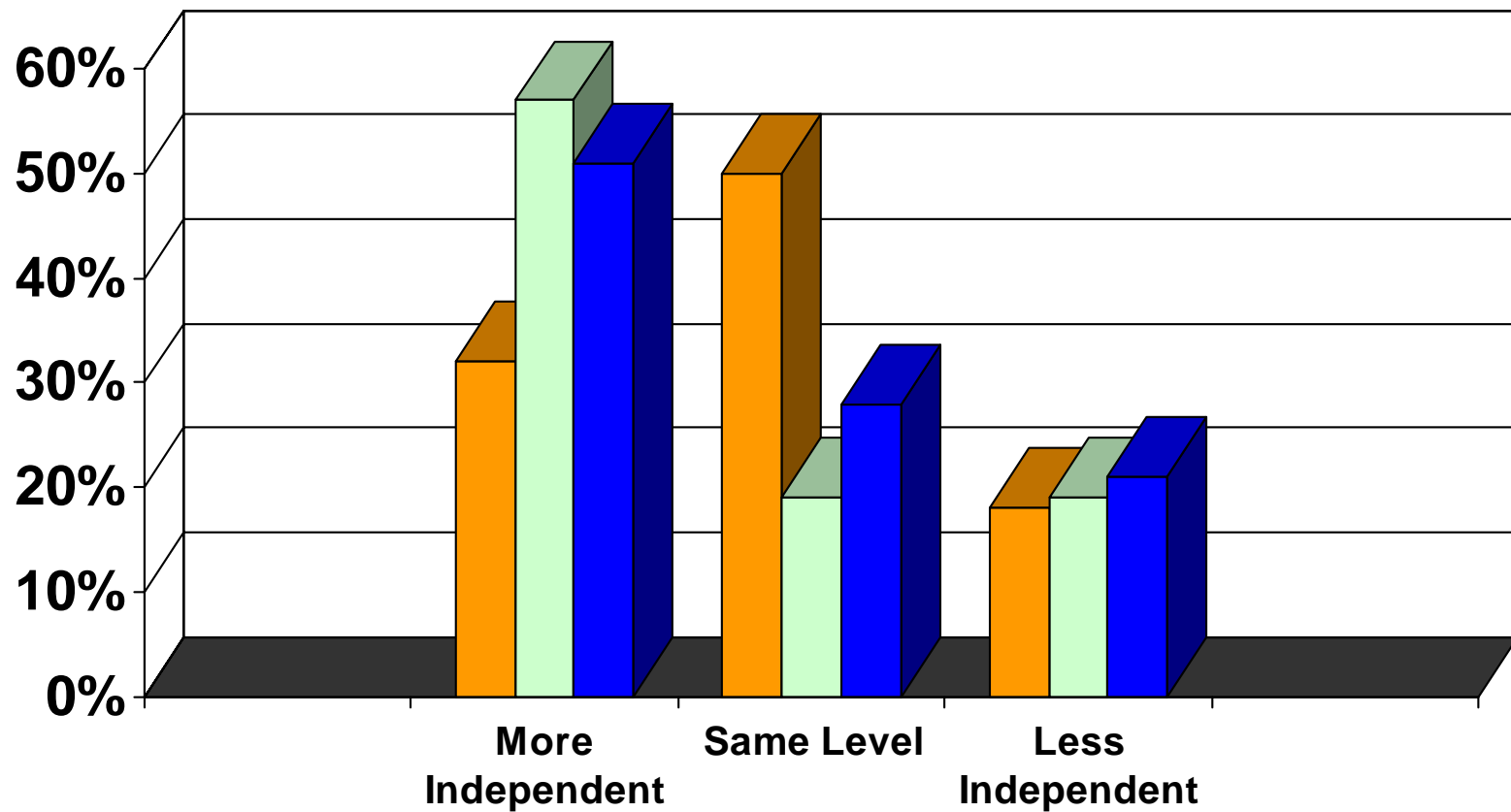


Overall Adjustment

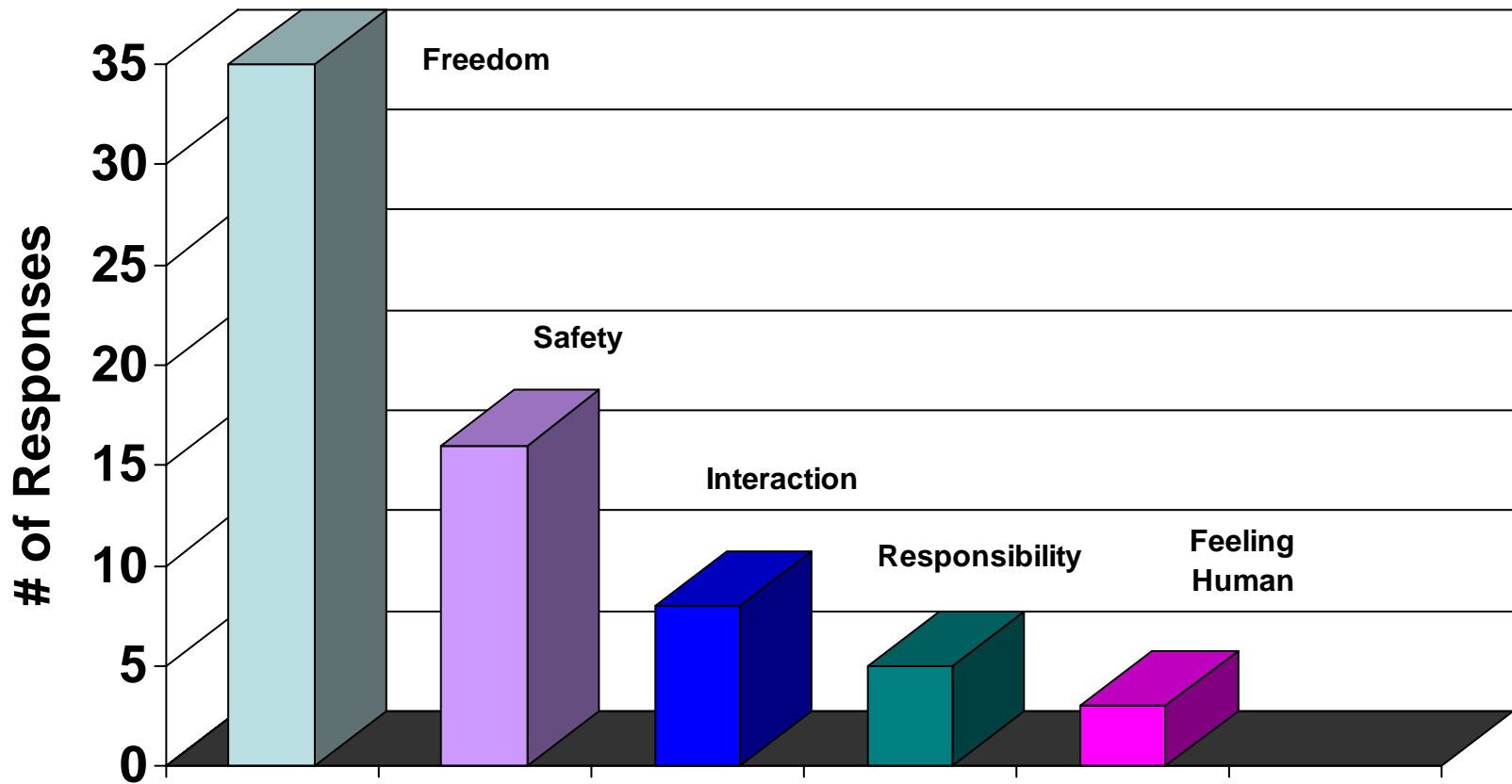


Independence Compared to Point of Discharge

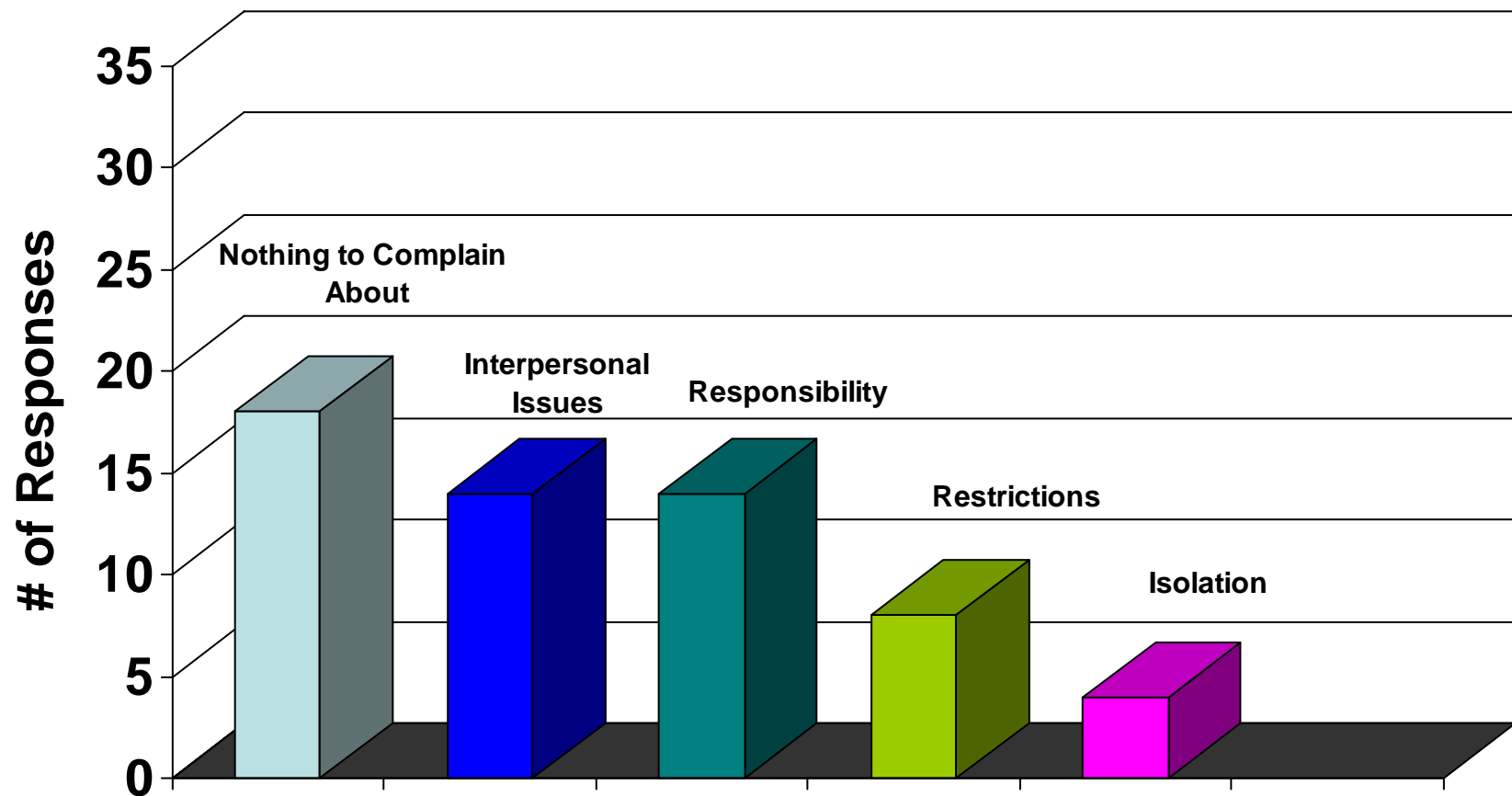

CERF-R Assessment

- 47% ↑ overall functioning skills
- 31% ↓ overall risk factors
