RESEARCH AND POLICY UPDATES

Burning the Candle at Both Ends: Sandwich Caregiving in the U.S.

This report by the National Alliance for Caregiving and Caregiving Across Generations shines light on the 11 million Americans caught between demands of both childcare and caring for an aging or disabled adult family member. In this diverse group, 67% are employed, 49% are Gen X, and the average age is 41.

Valuing the Invaluable 2019 Update: Charting a Path Forward

On November 14, AARP released an update to its comprehensive report on family caregiving. It estimates that 34 billion hours of care are provided annually at a national cost of \$470 billion, and an average out-of-pocket cost of \$7,000.

RAISE Act Family Caregiver Resource and Dissemination Center Established

The National Academy of State Health Policy (NASHP) has created a center to support the Family Caregiving Advisory Council's efforts. The center will develop resources for policymakers and council members, convene thought leaders to provide expertise, and support state policy efforts.

It's Time for Presidential Candidates to Address the Needs of Caregivers

This opinion piece in *The Hill* emphasizes caregiving's public nature, its growing burden on society, and three questions all candidates should be asked: How can we creatively address the physical and financial burdens of caregiving? Will you support a new program Americans can proactively pay into and access as needed? What do you see as the greatest challenge facing caregivers and how would you address it?
