Honorable Senate and House of Representatives :-

herewith present to you, the Ninth Annual Report from department, it being for the year ending December 31, made in obedience to the requirements of the law of establishing the office of State Auditor.

The Report will contain a statement of all the property of Commonwealth, both productive and unproductive, with the sumt of its debts and liabilities at the close of the year 1857, amount received and paid from the treasury during the at, together with an estimate of the receipts and expenditers for the year 1858.

Inving exercised the privilege, in my last year's Report, of alling the attention of the legislature to some of the evils which appeared to exist, and suggesting remedies so far as was residered proper in my position, I deem it but just to say, after other another year's experience, that I can see no reason to dange the views then expressed. It is highly gratifying to me believe that the object of that Report has been somewhat to the proper in the effect to awaken in the people broughout the Commonwealth, a deep interest in the financial modifien and welfare of the State.

MASSACHUSETTS SCHOOL AND OTHER FUNDE DETAIL.

The following is a detailed account of the various to belonging to the Commonwealth, the income of which specifically appropriated.

MASSACHUSETTS SCHOOL FUND.

This fund was established in 1834, when it was provided one-half of all the moneys received for sales of land in Masshould be added to the amount received of the General Goment ment in 1831, and the income thereof annually apport among the towns of the Commonwealth for the support of the mon schools.

It was provided by the Act of 1846, chapter 219, that charges for educational purposes should be paid from the purpal of this fund, which provision retarded its increase 1853, when the sale of the remainder of the lands in Mar added to the fund about \$323,000.

In conformity with the Act of 1854, chap. 300, the Treasure of the Commonwealth transferred to this fund 2,944 de-Western Railroad Stock, and by the provisions of said Act charges for educational purposes are paid from one-half of annual income of the fund, and the other half apportioned distributed equally among the cities and towns, for the sup of common schools, in the manner heretofore provided for the distribution of the whole income.
