MEDFIBLD INSANE AsyLIDI.

Cm.pter 445, Acts 18,0, provided for the appointment of commissioners, " with full power to purchase or bond, ablect to the approval ?f the overnor and Council, suitable reaf estate in the eastern part of the Commonwealth consisting of not less than three hundred acres of land, mutable for all sanitary purposes as a site for an asylum for the chronic insane, for one thousand patients." They were authorized to procure plans, specifications, etc. The sum at \$30,000 was appropriated, and of this sum \$22,673.161 for lan'a, etc., was expended, and the commissioners made, their rt. By chapter 425, Acts of 1892, authority was to build an asylum for the !!hronic insane on the land for onl: thousand patients, "substantially in cordance with the plans, specifications and estimates subted by the commissioners appointed under authority of

Considerable doubt having arisen in the minds of State officials us to whose duty it was to supervise the printing 40 ne under a contract with the wright & Potter Pmoling Company, the following law was passed by the Legisliture

[Cm.P. 287.]

AN ACT. RELA.TIVE TO TUE SUPERVI:510N OF STATE PRINTING.

Be it ellacled, etc., as follows:

SECTION 1. The secretary of the CommonWealth chall, addition to his other duties, supervise the stote printing. auditor of the Commonwealth shall cause to be measured all the printing clone under the state printing contract, and nobulat printing shall be allowed unless they are found to be in street conformity to said contract. In order to properly cont out provisions of this net the auditor may employ an expert in pr ing, and may expend annually for such service a sum nol exce ing one thousand dollars.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon its passage. proved May 3, 1893. .






