### Bm·ial Expenses of Incligent Solclie1's and Sailor., an Wives and 1Vidows.

The law relating to the burial expenses of soldies peulm1 by the Legislature of 1896, and chapter 219, April 14, 18\JG, was substituted. This h1-v,:enlsco·pc, provides that the bu1-ial agent r:tiaTbe within one week of the d:ltc of death, and if upottiment tion he shall fiuth the decease was eligible to lete benefits of the act, be may authorize :n expense not ing \$35.

It also provides for the burial expenses f 61,tain, wive widows, provided they were miu-l'icd pr-ior to the final charge of the soldier from the service.

Under the provisions of this law there were returned to burials, including 15 wido\vs and 5 wives; involving to pense to the Commonwealth of \$16,678.25.

The increase of burials in 1896 ovcr 1895 wills 81, 44 creased expense of \$2,843.45.

Of the 352 cities and towns, there are only 10 towns pay neither State nor military aid, and 301 cities and town have appointed bm-ial ng;ents.

The three agents of the commissioners have been stead employed in visiting the different municipalities, examine into the methods of disbursing aid and the huria:lof-sold correcting faults of administration and making personal aruinations of recipients. It is intended to bave even and lurge town visited and the disbursements for State thoroughly examined once in two years, and oftener if sible. About 5,000 individual cases were examined due the year 1896.






