The contingent debt is a loan of the credit of the Commonwealth to certain metropolitan clistricts for water, sewerage and parks, and to certain cities for the building of armories; and the interest and simking fund requirements are amually assessed upon said cities and districts, no portion of the debt being a liability of the Commonwealth at large.

In the following table the estimated revenue of 1905 , applicable to running expenses, the amount actually received and the sources from which it was clerived, are given : -

${ }^{1}$ Includes $\$ 50,764.60$ acerued interest on bonds sold and interest on advances to cities and towns for the abolition of crade crossinirs.

The large increase in the revenue above the estimates inclicates general business prosperity. It will be noted that almost all the items show a material increase, the one exception, however, being foreign railroal companies' tax, the decrease in which is due to the fact that the Mexican Central Railroad Company questions the validity of the tax, and that question is being settled by litigation.

## Actual Revenle and Expenses for 1900

The Auditor's estimates corer appropriations and requirements to meet existing legislation, but do not comprehend the probable action of the Legislature in the matter of special appropriations. Your predecessors of 1905 appropriated for purposes not included in the Auditor's estimates about $\$ 700,000$. It being apparent that there is already about $\$ 2,800,000$ to be provided for, should jou appropriate no more than was appropriated last year, the State tax would be $\$ 3,500,000$. In the exercise of a wise discretion, should the special appropriations be for a less amomet, the tax can be correspondingly reduced.

Charles River Basin Loan.
During the year $1900^{5}$ bonds have been issued under the authority of chapter 465 of the Acts of 1903 , which provides for the construction of a dam across the Charles River between the cities of Boston and Cambridge, to the amount of $\$ 400,000$, bearing interest at $3 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent., making a total issue for this purpose of $\$ 650,000$.

## Metiofolitan Parks Loan.

During the year 1905 bonds have been issued to the amount of $\$ 370,000$, bearing interest at the rate of 31 per cent., $\$ 300,000$ uncler the authority of chapter 429 of the Acts of 1903 , which provices for an anuual issue of that amount in each year for five years, and $\$ 70,000$ under the authority of clapter 326 of the Acts of 1904 , for the construction of a public bath house on Nabant Beach. The total issue for park purposes is $\$ 8,690,000$.

## Metropolitan Loan for Parkways and Boulevards

During the year 1905 bonds were issued under the authority of chapter 419 of the Acts of 1903 to the amount of $\$ 300,000$, bearing interest at $3 \underset{2}{2}$ per cent., making a total issue for these purposes of $\$ 4,4 \$ 5,000$. This is the third anuual issue of the same amount, the aet referred to providing for such anuual issue for five years. One-half of this loan is the debt of the State at large, the balance of the metropolitan park district.

## Metropolitan Sewerage Loan

There has been no further issue of bonds, either for the north or the south system, cluring the year. The total amount of bouch issued for sewerage purposes is $\$ 13,797,912$. Of this amount, $\$ 6,095,000$ was issued for the north metropolitan system and \$7,702,912 for the south metropolitan system.

Metropolitan Water Loan.
Uuder authority of chapter 488 of the Acts of 1895 , additional bonds have been issued to coutiaue the work of the metropolitan water system to the amount of $\$ 650,000$, making the total issue to Jau. 1, 1906, \$39,150,000.

Prisons and Hosirtals Loan.
During the gear 1905 bonds have been issued, under the authority of chapter 446 of the Acts of 1904 aud chapter 128 of the Acts of 1905 , to the amount of $\$ 300,000$, for the establislument of the Massachusetts School and Home for Crippled and Deformed Childreu.

## State Holse Loan.

Under the authorily of clapter 537 of the Acts of 1.901 there has been a further issue of bonds to the amount of $\$ 60,000$, to be used principally to pay claims arising under the law limiting the height of structures on Beacon Hill. These bouds were issued at the rate of $3 \frac{1}{t}$ per cent., and are due Oct. 1,1018 . The total issue of bonds for all purposes in conuection with the coustruction or remodelling of the State House, to Jan. 1, 1906, is $\$ 7,080,000$.

The bouds now outstanding amount to $\$ 4,745,000$.

## State Highway Loan.

Uucler the authority of chapter 280 of the Acts of 1903 , boucls to the amount of $\$ 250,000$ were issued for the construction of State highways, bearing interest at the rate of $3 \frac{1}{2}$ per cent. This
makes a total issue of bonds for highway purposes, to Jau. 1, 1906, of $\$ 4,775,000$.

The total amount of loans authorized by the Legislature is \$6,850,000.
The total expeuclitures to Jau. 1, 1906, which inclucles the expeuses of the temporary commission and of the permanent commission, from appropriations and loans, hare been $\$ 6,113,591.76$.

This amount does not inclucle interest or sinking fund requirements.
