### SCOPE OF AUDIT

An examination has been made of the accounts of the Legislative Research the Legislative Research Bureau covering the period from February 4, 1974 and the Legislative Research Bureau covering the period from February 4, 1974

Appropriations: All appropriation expenditures are preaudited by the payrolls. The salaries are recorded on monthly payrolls.

### NOTES AND COMMENTS

General: The Legislative Research Council and the Legislative Research redu were created by Chapter 607, Section 2 of the Acts of 1954 and commenced redu were created by The research projects conducted by the Council and real may be classified as follows:

- Research assignments by the General Court, which invariably constitute major and lengthy work projects resulting in printed reports.
- 2. Research requests made by individual members, committees and commissions of the General Court. This type of project generally is less extensive in scope and may result in a typed or mimeographed report. However, certain of these requests are readily satisfied orally or by providing available material relevant to the information desired.
