³ Adverse Effects can be related to medical and surgical care procedures, or to the use of therapeutic substances (including allergic reactions). Please note that in 2012, we began using the the same definition for injury deaths as the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) which excludes adverse effects. The numbers are still provided, but are not included in total injury deaths.

[—]An injury-related fatality is defined as any death with an ICD-10 code of U01-U03, V01-Y36, Y85-Y87 or Y89 in the underlying cause field.

[—]Categories and groupings are based on the CDC's "Recommended framework of E-code groupings for presenting injury mortality and morbidity data." This framework does not provide for intentionality for certain cause categories as indicated by gray shading.
