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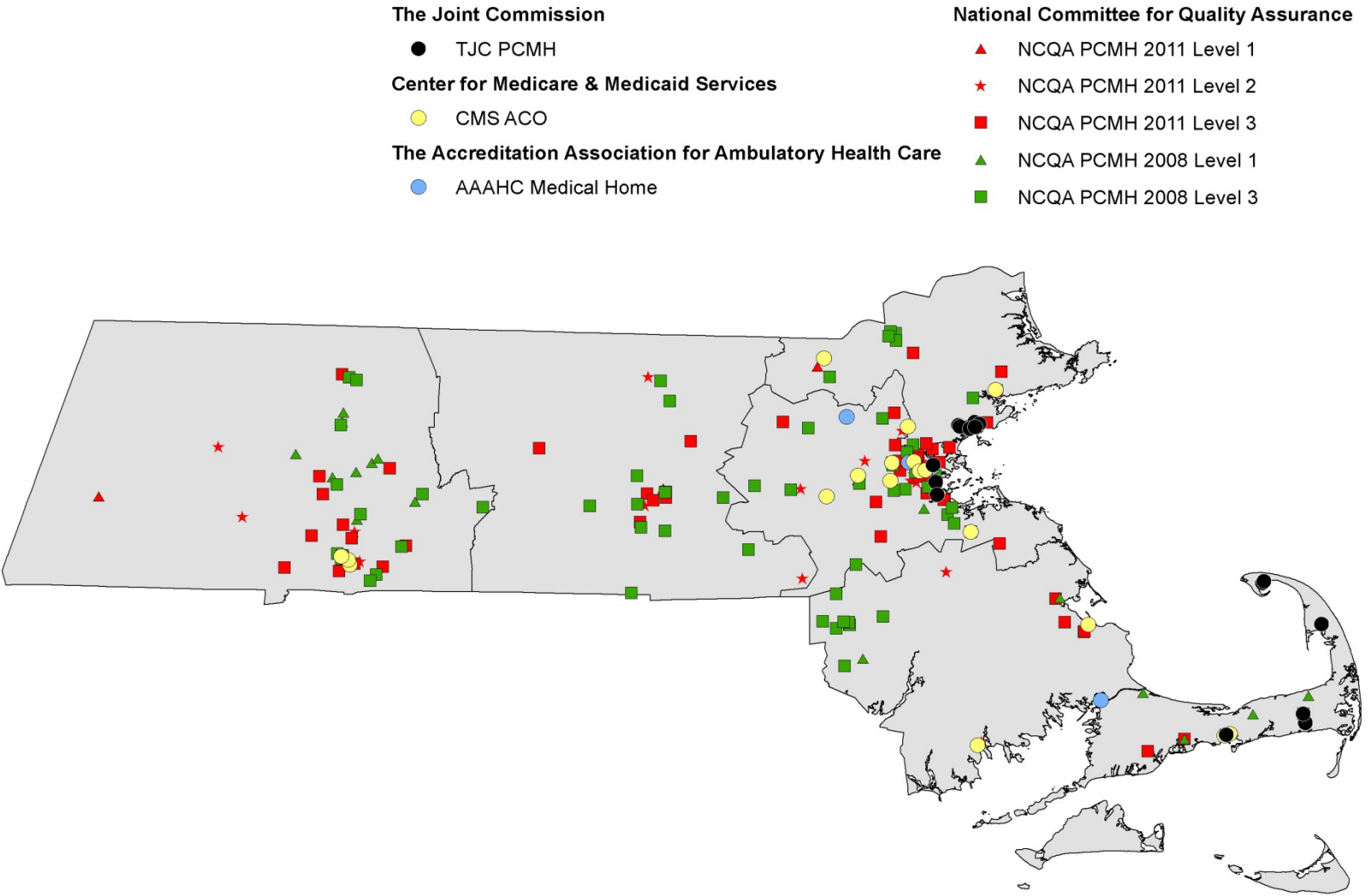
Overview of HPC approach

- Goals of HPC PCMH effort
 - Emphasize “*high-value*” elements
 - Involve multiple payers to support practice transformation
 - Approach to initial pilot
 - Build on PCMH models & associated payment approaches that currently exist in MA
 - Identify and highlight areas where payment is already aligned or can be harmonized
 - Approach to refinement & scale
 - Evaluate pilot results
 - Document impact of high value elements – identified via certification – on TME and quality
 - Build case for greater participation by payers & practices
 - Refine model & payment methods, based on this evidence.
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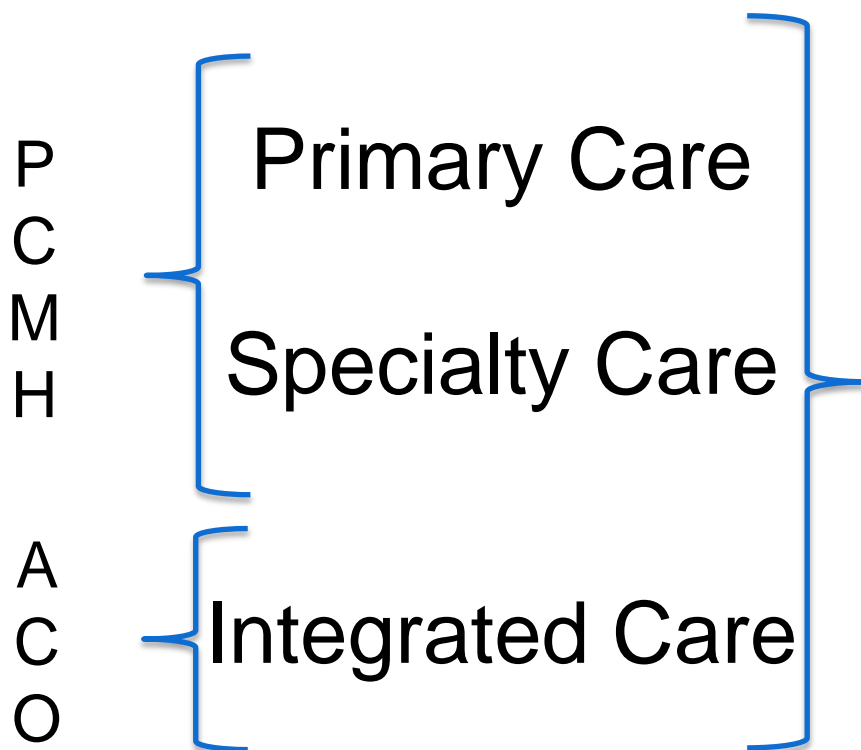
Opportunities to accelerate advanced primary care in MA

- Current status of PCMH certification
 - Total of 198 practices certified to date (January 2014 data)
 - Approximately 5 new practices certified/month
 - Rolling expirations of existing certifications:
 - 2014: 15% practices
 - 2015: 40% practices
 - 2016: 45% practices
 - HPC certification model:
 - Align payment with PCMH care certification
 - “On ramp” for advanced primary care (Pathway)
 - Less burdensome (financial and administrative)

HPC accountable care standards – local & national alignment

- National certification standards
- Payer/purchaser advanced primary care requirements
- Local primary care transformation initiatives
- Practice setting applications (pediatric, behavioral health, specialty practice)
- HPC behavioral health integration pathway (joint Committee discussion with QIPP)

HPC PCMH Certification: three-pronged approach

1

Standardize criteria for accountable care:

certify practices demonstrating progress in implementing the PCMH care model, as measured by the number of capabilities implemented and in active use across domains

2

Align payment with PCMH capabilities:

leverage the efforts of multiple payers to support implementation of high-value elements of accountable care to transform primary care practice and achieve the triple aim

3

Monitor impact on accountable care: assess the impact of alternative payment models on the adoption of high-value elements of accountable care, as measured by quality, utilization and efficiency of care provided at certified practices

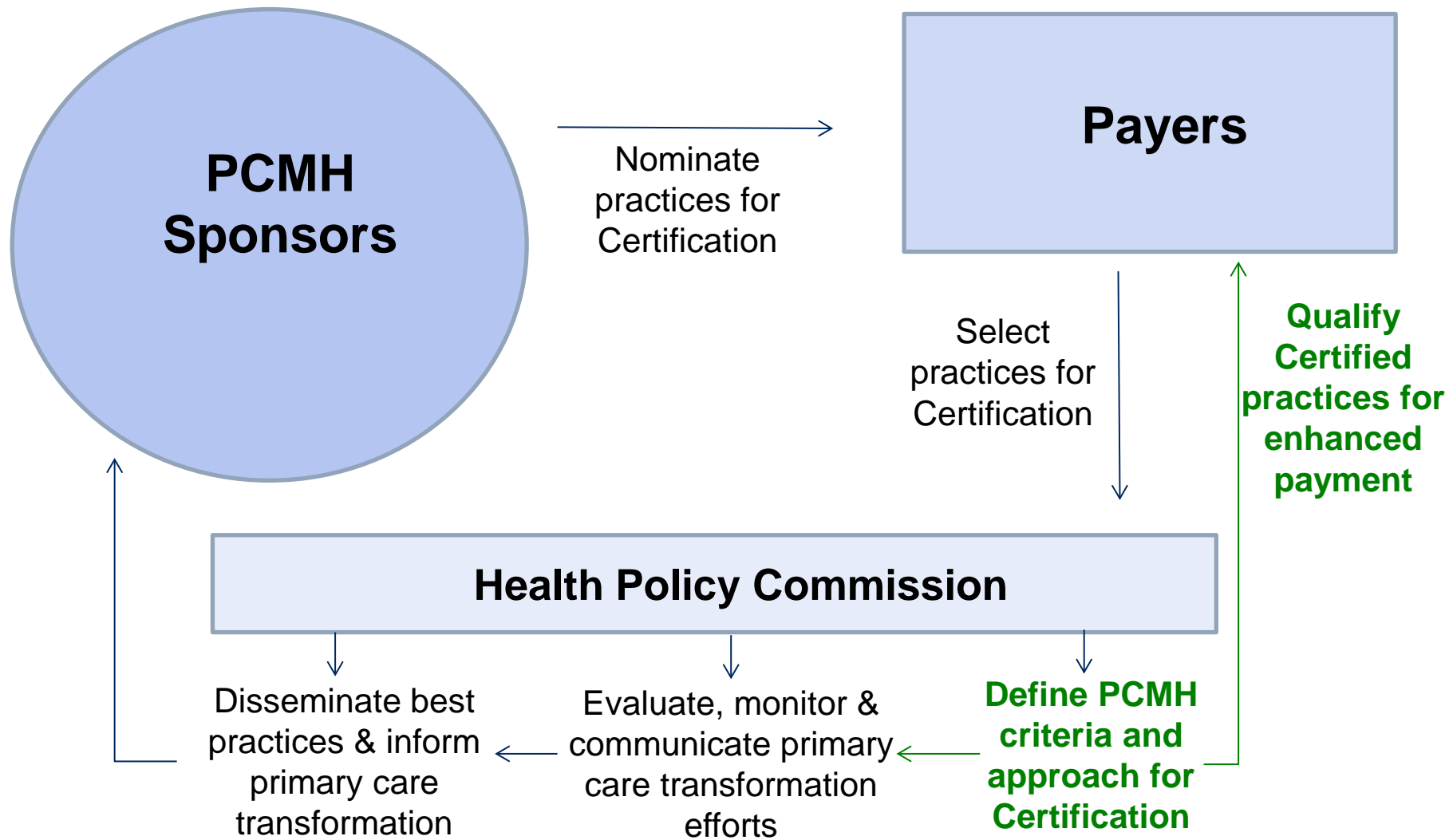

HPC PCMH Certification Model



MA PCMH Demonstration (Phase I)

- 1 Collaborate with primary care sponsors to use accountable care criteria to inform learning communities and PCMH implementation efforts
 - 2 Engage payers to use common set of core criteria as gateway for PCMH payment
 - 3 Validate practice capability on PCMH Pathway to qualify practices for enhanced payment
 - 4 Assess the impact of various payment models on the adoption of high-value elements and the impact on cost & quality
 - 5 Inform value-based care considerations and primary care transformation efforts through transparent data on comparative results
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Next steps (February – May 2014)

- Confirm payers and sponsor organization(s) for 2014 PCMH Demonstration (expected to begin by Q3 2014)
 - Consider focus areas for application of targeted criteria (high cost clinical conditions and population health priorities)
 - Joint meeting with QIPP to develop and plan for behavioral health integration
 - Finalize criteria and measures for public comment period
 - Develop guidelines for evaluating practices (i.e. composite of performance and practice capability results)
 - Convene payers, purchasers and health systems to share goals on HPC approach for primary care transformation

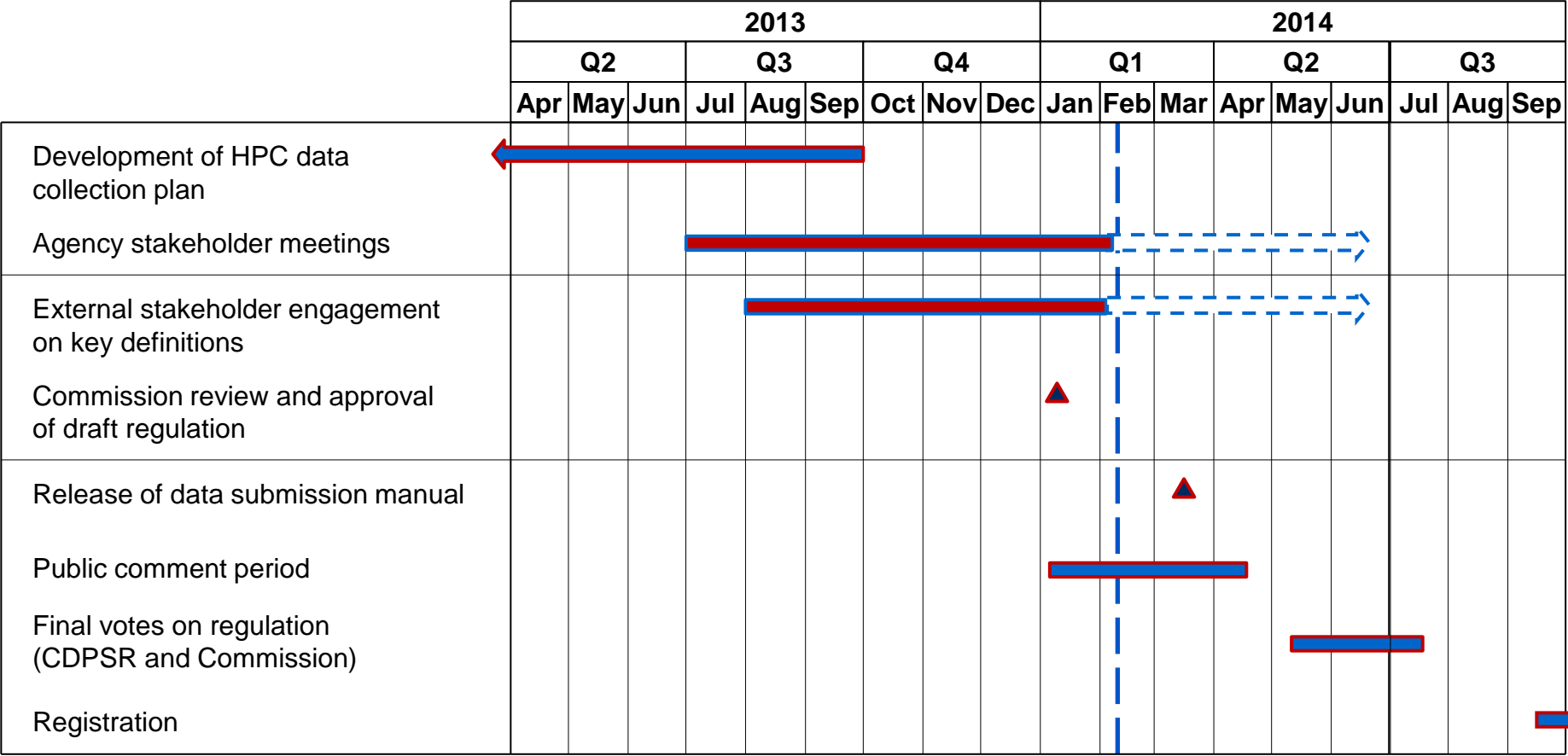
