Massachusetts Hate Crimes, 2015

Executive Summary

Bias Motivation

“Hate crimes,” also referred to interchangeably as “bias crimes,” or “bias-related / motivated crimes” are not reported as a stand-alone offense, but rather as part of a separate criminal violation, ranging from violent crimes to harassment to vandalism. Of the 424 hate crime offenses reported in 2015, the most frequent offense was Intimidation (31.4%), which predominately is comprised of instances of both verbal and written threats which place the victim in fear for his or her safety. Destruction / Damage / Vandalism of Property, Simple Assault and Aggravated Assault incidents were the only remaining incident types with double digit percentages with 25.9%, 22.4% & 11.6% respectively. In terms of violent crime, there were 49 bias-motivated aggravated assaults reported in 2015, which is comparable to the 42 reported in 2014. (See Table 1.)

In 2015, similar to years past, prejudice against race / ethnicity or national origin was the most widely reported bias motivation, representing 47.6% of the total (up from 43% in 2014). Bias against religious groups was the second most frequent bias motivation with 19.1% of the total (up from 16.8% in 2014). Sexual Orientation bias was third with 18.2% (down from 20.5% in 2014). (See Table 2.)

Victims and Offenders

As in previous years, males were the most frequent victims (53.7% of known victims). This number has been steadily falling for the past several years as males previously accounted for approximately 70% of victims as recently as 2012. The known offenders of hate crimes continue to be predominantly male with 78% of offenders identified as males. Females were victims in 46.3% of incidents where the sex of the victim was identified. In only 5.4% of cases was the sex of the victim unknown or undetermined, which is down from over 20% in 2014. Females as a percentage of offenders where sex was determined accounted for 22% (down from 28.7% in 2014). (For a breakdown of victims and offenders by gender, please refer to Tables 13 and 15.) Whites were the most frequent racial category as victims (61.3%, up from the low 50's over the past three years), and also as offenders (73.3%, up from 69.3% the previous year). African American victims of both genders composed 29.4% of the total victim population, down from 32.1% the previous year. African American offenders comprised 22.9% of offenders, down from 25.7% the previous year. (See Table 14.)

Victims were reported to have some type of injury in 33.2% of cases where injury information was captured. This is consistent with 2014 where 34.9% of cases reported some form of injury. The past two years, Aggravated Assaults have been up, which may contribute to the increase in reported injuries. (See Table 16.)

Location

Bias incidents reported by police agencies in Massachusetts occur in a variety of locations, both public and private. In 2015, 31.1% of incidents occurred in or at a residence, while an additional 18.9% occurred on a highway or street, and the third most frequent location were schools and colleges at 12.2%, which includes elementary schools through Colleges / Universities. (See Table 10.) All three of these categories were extremely consistent with 2014 numbers. Other location types with over 10 incidents were Parking / Drop Lot / Garage; Church / Synagogue / Temple / Mosque; Commercial / Office Building and Government / Public Building; although none of these location types eclipsed 5% of the total.

Targets

Individuals and private property were the primary targets for hate crimes in the Commonwealth, with 80.4% of the reports, down from 83.1% in 2014. Businesses were the second most-frequent target in 2015 with 7.4% of the reports. Government and Religious Organization targets, comprising 4% & 2.8% of the incidents were notable, as well as other targets with 2.6%. (See Table 9.)

Hate Crimes Historical Perspective

Over the past 15 years, the numbers and the categories of bias motivations have remained fairly consistent. Between 2000 and 2002, approximately 500 bias motivations were reported each year. From 2003 through 2015, the number has declined to an average of about 350 bias motivations per year and has remained extremely consistent over this extended period. Over this time period, the most frequently reported bias motivations have remained similar: Anti-Black bias has consistently been most frequent (roughly 30% of the total), followed by Anti-Gay (19.5%), Anti-Semitic (15%) and Anti-White (10%). Please note all above percentages are rounded. (See Table 16.)

Notes on Data

The 2015 Hate Crime report for Massachusetts was compiled using data voluntarily supplied from police departments across the Commonwealth. The Executive Office of Public Safety & Security (EOPSS) received a total of 411 reports of incidents of hate crime (up from 375 in 2014) from 74 municipal police departments and 10 campus police agencies. In addition, 257 agencies successfully submitted “zero reports” (indicating that they had experienced no bias-motivate incidents) and there were 70 non-reporting agencies, down from 105 in 2014. In 2015, reporting agencies and zero-reporting agencies covered approximately 95% of the population of Massachusetts. After receipt and state data quality checks, EOPSS submits all Massachusetts hate crime data to the FBI for further analysis and inclusion in its annual *Hate Crime Statistics* publication. (Please note the 2014 Hate Crime Report previously stated there were 415 reported incidents when in fact there were 375 reported incidents in 2014. All other 2014 data was accurate).

Hate crimes are reported as a part of an incident. A hate crime incident may have multiple victims, offenders, offenses, and bias motivations. In addition, some reports are submitted with missing data. As a result of these issues, the totals in the following tables may not be the same across categories.

Definitions

<i>Hate Crime</i>	Any criminal act to which a bias motive is evident as a contributing factor. The MA Hate Crime Reporting Act of 1991 covers bias on account of race, religion, ethnicity, handicap, gender, or sexual orientation. Hate crimes can be reported only by law enforcement agencies. See M.G.L. c. 22C, § 32 for more details.
<i>Zero Report</i>	An official report by a police department stating no hate crimes were reported to the department during the reporting period.
<i>Non-reporting agencies</i>	Local police departments, and other law enforcement agencies, which are not in compliance with the provisions of the Reporting Act. These agencies failed to indicate how many, if any, bias crimes occurred in their jurisdiction.
<i>Reporting agencies</i>	Local police departments, as well as other law enforcement agencies, who have voluntarily reported the incidence of identified bias crimes in their jurisdiction. Agencies can comply with the Reporting Act by reporting the number of bias crimes, even if zero.

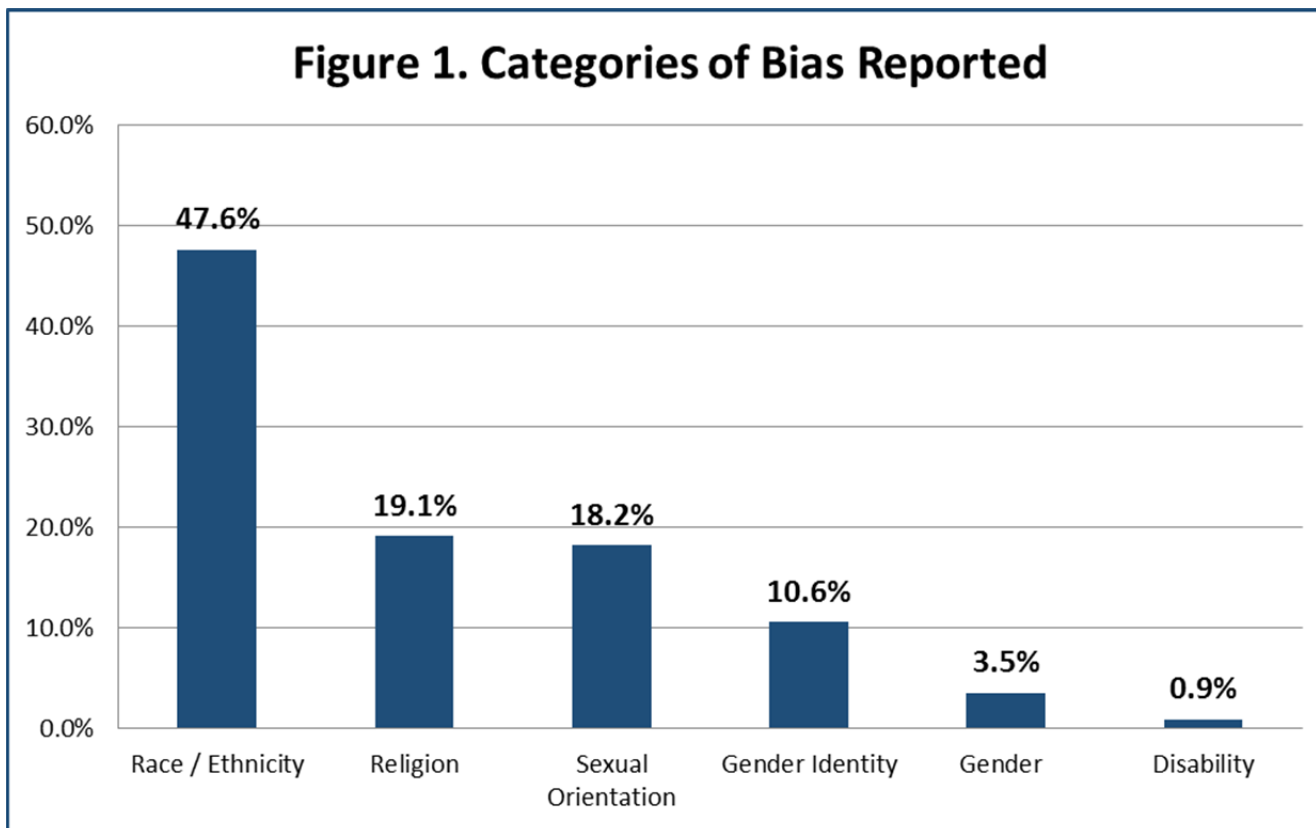
Reports by Law Enforcement Agencies

In the statistics that follow, it should be noted that a single incident report may include multiple offenses, bias motivations, victims or offenders. As a result, totals in some categories may exceed the number of reports. Similarly, some reports omit information in certain categories, resulting in totals lower than the number of incident reports collected.

Hate crimes were reported by a total of 85 different law enforcement agencies. A total of 411 hate crime reports were filed by these agencies, which included 430 reported bias motivations and 424 separate offenses.

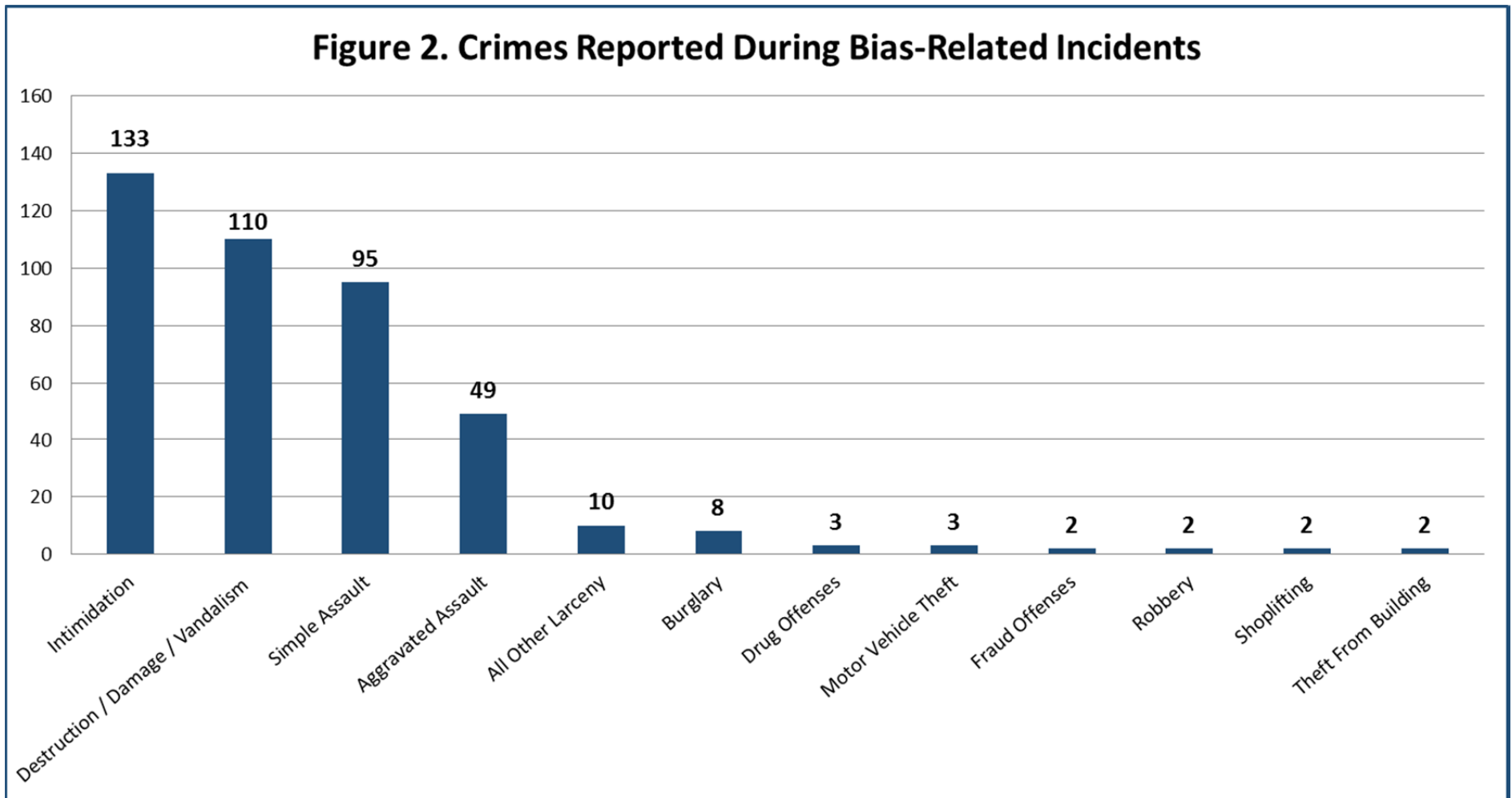
Categories of Bias Reported

Of the 430 bias motivations for particular incidents reported, race / ethnicity / national origin bias constituted the largest category of reported motives, with 47.6% of the total (up from 43% in 2014). Offenses related to religious affiliation were the second most prevalent, with 19.1% (up from 16.8% in 2014). Offenses motivated by sexual orientation bias were the third most frequent category, with 18.2% of the total (down from 20.5% in 2014), while gender identity biased offenses were reported in 10.6% of incidents.



Categories of Crimes Reported

Of the 424 total offenses reported, Threats & Intimidation were the most frequently reported offenses, representing 31.4% of the total with over 130 incidents reported. Destruction of Property / Vandalism was the second most frequently reported offense, with 110 incidents representing 25.9% of the total offenses. Assaults also formed a significant portion of incidents, accounting for 22.4% and 11.6% respectively. Combining Aggravated and Simple Assaults would yield 144 assaults where offenders physically confronted a victim.

Victim and Offender Profile

An Individual / Person (including private property) was the target in 80.4% of cases (down from 82.5% in 2014). Businesses were second, with 7.3% (equal to the 2014 percentage). Government targets were the third most frequently targeted group with 2.8% of the incidents (up from 2.7% in 2014). Religious targets were fourth with 2.7% (up from 1.6% the previous year).

In the 354 incidents where the victim's race was reported, whites were victims 61.3% of the time (up from 59.5% in 2014), while African Americans were victims in 29.4% of cases (down from 32.1% in 2014). The victims were male in 53.7% of cases. This year, the most common age group reporting hate crimes was 26-30 year olds. Last year, it was most likely to be 21-25.

The perpetrator(s) of hate crimes were white in 73.3% of cases (up from 69.3% in 2014), and African American in 22.9% of cases (down from 25.7% in 2014), in the 236 cases where this information was identified. The perpetrator was male in 78% of known cases (up from 71.3% in 2014), and of the cases where the offender(s)'s age group was identified, the most frequently reported age group was 36-40 years of age, which is significantly older than year's past.

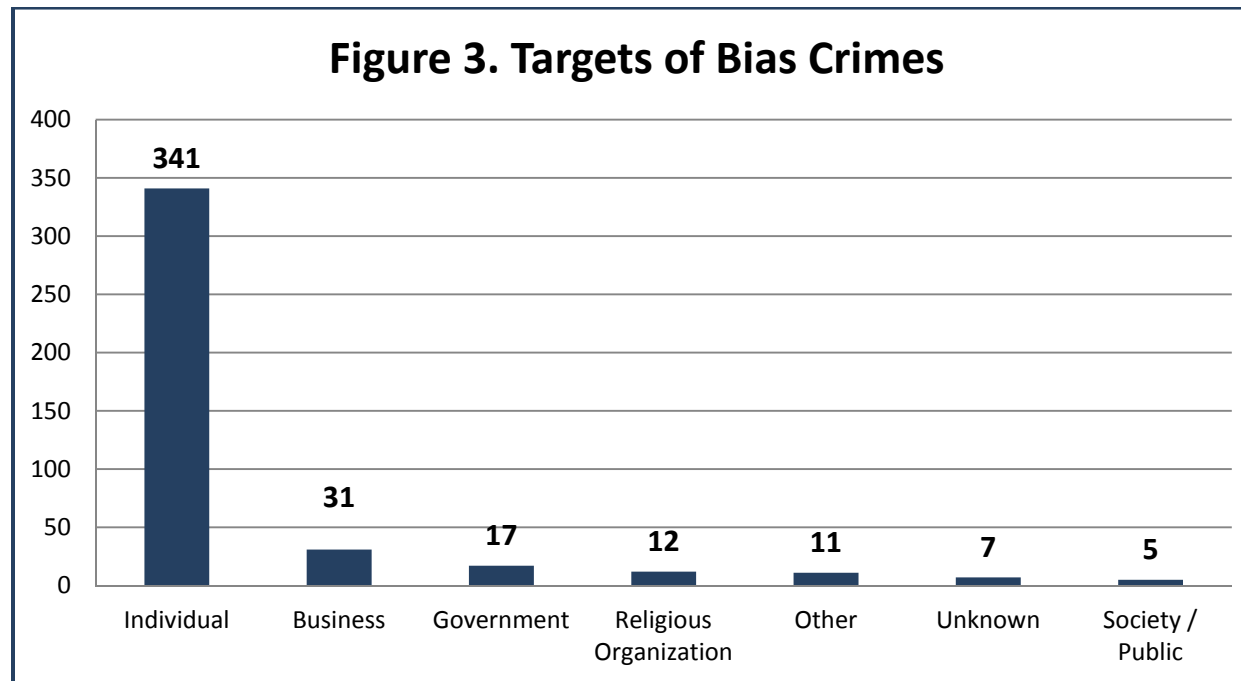


Figure 4. Victim and Offender by Race

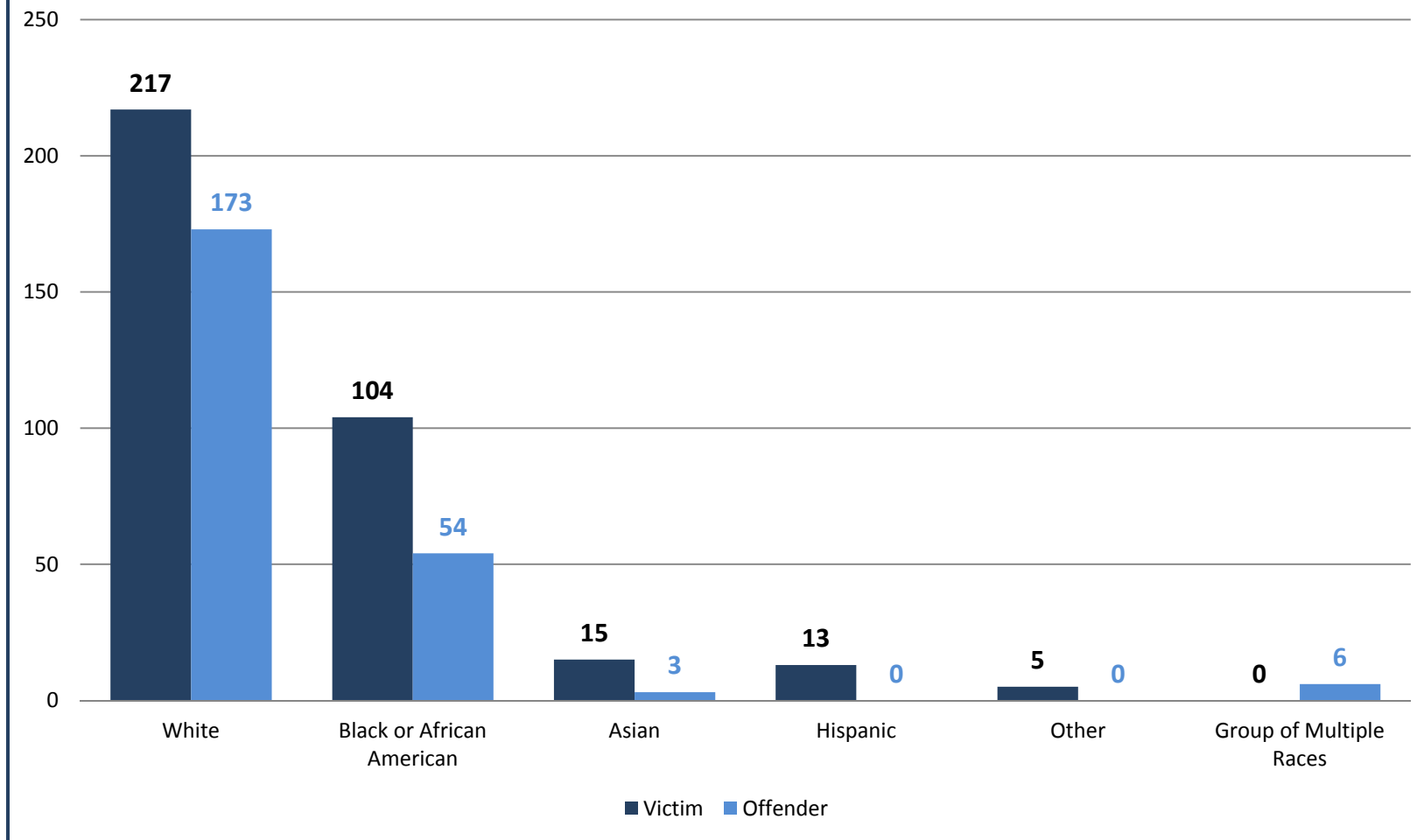


Figure 5. Victim and Offender by Age Group

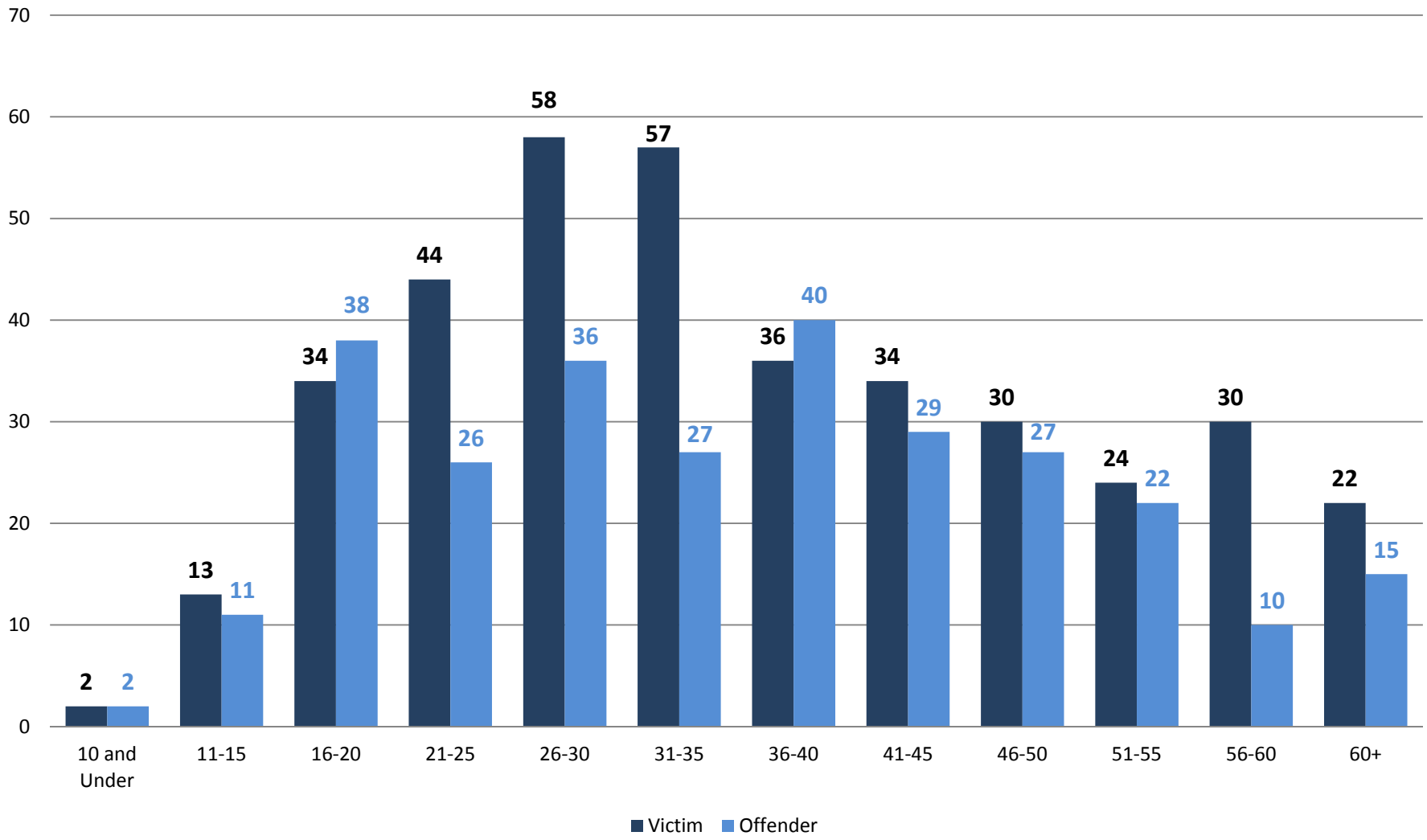
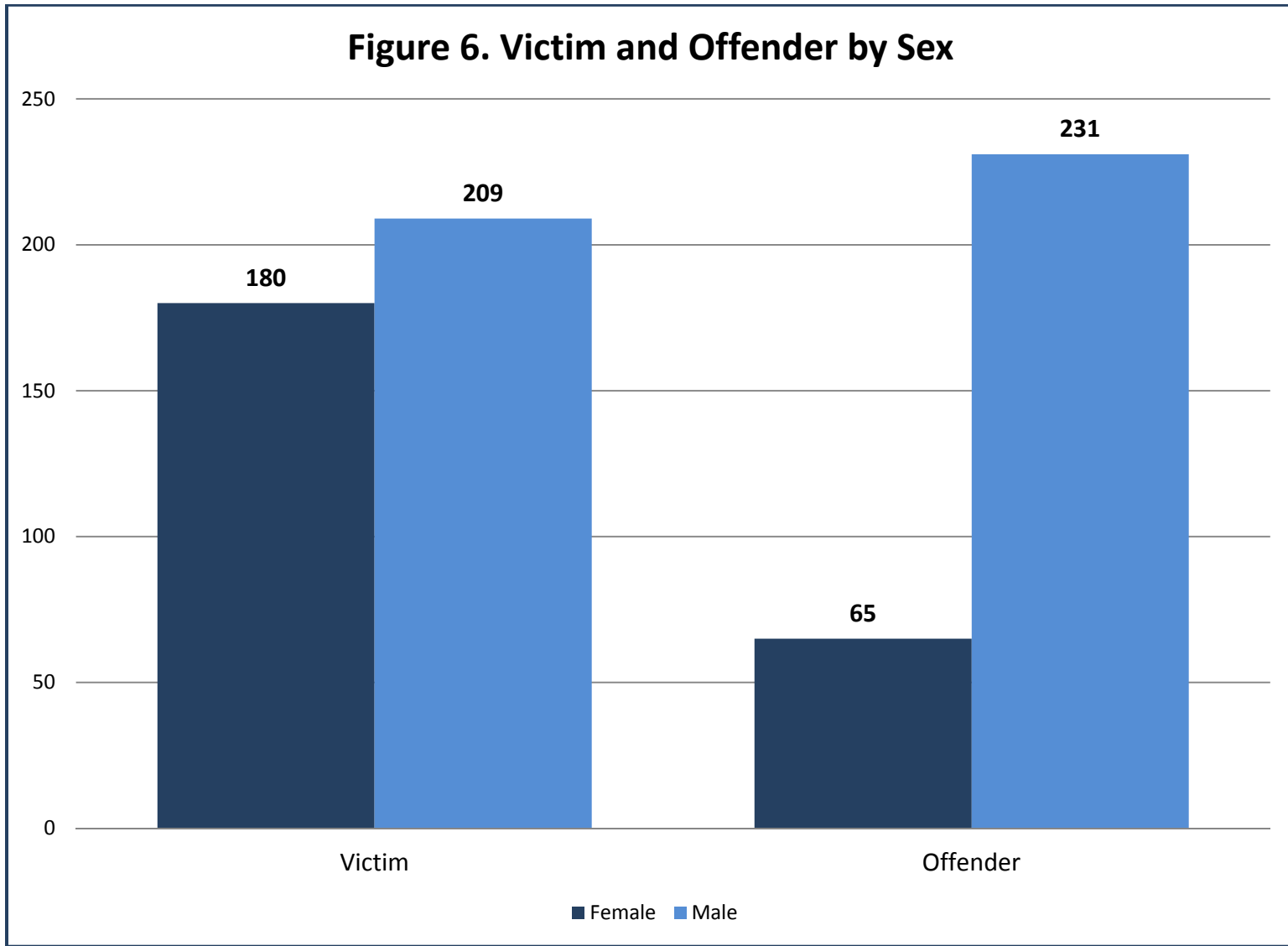


Figure 6. Victim and Offender by Sex



Characteristics of the Incidents

The majority of hate crime incidents in 2015 occurred in residences (31.1%, down from 33.9% in 2014); followed by highways or streets (18.9%, up from 16.9% in 2014). Other locations where incidents occurred, in descending order, were schools / colleges (12.2%, down from 13% in 2014); other / unknown locations (5.7%); parking lots / garages (4.7%); churches / synagogues / temples / mosques (3.5%); commercial / office buildings (3.3%) and government / public buildings (2.7%). (See Table 9.)

Weapons of some type were reported in 111 incidents. In cases where the type of weapon was identified, hands / fist / feet were used the most frequently (30.7%, up from 20.2% in 2014). Other weapons were the second most frequently, listed in 12.4% of cases. Knives and blunt objects were both utilized in 5% cases. Firearms were only used in 3 incidents in 2015 up from 2 in 2014. (See Table 11.)

Of the 225 incidents in which injury information was submitted, no visible injuries were reported in 150 (66.7%) of the incidents. Minor injuries were reported in 63 incidents; broken bones, severe lacerations and internal injuries were reported infrequently. (See Table 16.)
