

Funded by the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security's Office of Grants and Research, the Charles E. Shannon Community Safety Initiative (Shannon) is modeled after the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention's Comprehensive Gang Model. Shannon is a multi-sector approach used to address a community's gang and youth violence problem. Each community receiving Shannon funding demonstrates the presence of risk factors for youth and gang violence. Shannon participants must be between the ages of 10-24 years.



Gang Activity in Fitchburg/Gardner

280 Active & Former Gang Members

45 Gang Members Under 25 In 2019, the Fitchburg Police Department (FPD) confirmed 280 active and former gang members from 25 different gangs in the region. Roughly, 16% of the gang members were under the age of 25. Gang activity in Fitchburg included weapons-related offenses, narcotics trafficking, violent offenses, and property crime. In 2019, FPD received 227 overdose calls, 24 suspected overdose related deaths, 143 calls regarding drug activity, 41 shots fired calls, and 15 weapons related calls.
