MASSACHUSETTS TIMBER HARVESTING LICENSE (THL) APPLICANTS

1. Applicants Form (For Fiscal Year July 1, 2017 – June 30, 2018)

Chapter 132, Section 46, of the Forest Cutting Practices Law requires that “no person, firm or corporation engage in the business of harvesting timber or other Forest products for hire or profit shall cut such products on land devoted to forest purposes and for purposes not exempted by Chapter 132, section 44 without first obtaining a license and to do so from the Director who is hereby authorized to issue such licenses, and to withhold or revoke such licenses, after a hearing for failure to comply with Sections 42 to 46, inclusive.”

The fee for this license is **\$15.00 for residents of the State and \$30.00 for non-residents and all licenses expire on June 30th of each year. This fee is non-refundable.**

The legislature provides a penalty of not more than \$500.00 for each violation of this law which requires that a license be outstanding in the name of the person, firm or corporation actually cutting forest products, whether on the land of the license holder or the land of another.

Application for the license shall be made on the attached form. We encourage all employees of a company/firm to obtain a license in their own name since they are subject to the same rules as individual licensed applicants. However, if a company desires to hold additional licenses to cover their employees, a separate application, with the correct application fee per employee, must be filled out and submitted on the attached form. The employee must then take and pass the current THL exam.

2. Other Mandatory Information

Chapter 132 Section 46 of the Massachusetts General Law requires:

“Applicants [for timber harvesting licenses] shall demonstrate general familiarity with the laws of the Commonwealth that concern timber harvesting and provide the Director [of the Division of Forest & Parks] such reasonable information as the Director may require concerning the amount and type of forest products cut [harvested, not milled or processed] by the applicant during the previous year.”


This passage refers to loggers of sawtimber and cordwood, including those connected with sawmills.

Therefore prior to issuance of a harvesting license, all applicants are required to:

- **Demonstrate general familiarity with the pertinent laws of the Commonwealth by either completing at least nine hours of continuing education over three consecutive years or by taking the timber harvester licensing exam**
- Complete the Business/forest information Questionnaire

3. Tax Compliance Certificate

Before the issuance of any license, the Department of Conservation and Recreation is required to file with the Department of Revenue a State Tax Compliance Certificate (found accompanying the application form). Complete the enclosed form and return it to this office with your application. You are required to submit either your Social Security Number or a Federal **Identification Number.**

Continuing Education Summary

All applicants who have had their Timber Harvester's License (THL) over three (3) consecutive years or more, must fill out this form with your Continuing Education credits. You must show 9 hours of education credits to recertify your current THL.

Failure to fill out this form will result in written notification to take and pass the next scheduled THL exam to continue to operate in Massachusetts.

(If you have had your Timber Harvester's License less than 3 years you are exempt from filling out this Continuing Education Summary form.)

RECERTIFICATION FOR EVERYONE

All licensed harvesters, including those employees identified on their employer's license applications (one for each employee), must each accumulate nine (9) continuing education hours within each three (3) year recertification period.

CONTACT HOURS

Each licensed harvester, (including employees listed on an employer's Timber harvesting licenses – one approved Timber Harvester's License for each employee with a separate THL number for each assigned person), is required to attend nine hours of continuing education within each three year recertification period. Each sixty minutes of training equals one "contact hour" of continuing education. Three (3) of these nine (9) hours, must focus on the Massachusetts Forest Cutting Practices Act (MGL Chapter 132, Sections 40-46) - Rules and Regulations 304 CMR 11.00: FOREST CUTTING PRACTICES, sponsored by the Massachusetts Department of Conservation and Recreation, Service Forestry Program. The remaining six (6) hours of continuing education can focus on a wide variety of subjects including but not limited to: wetland identification, wetland values and functions, rare species habitat protection, safety, business management, equipment maintenance, new equipment technologies, communication skills, natural resource management, forest product measurement, grading lumber or standing timber, wildlife management, and forestry engineering.
