

Funded by the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security's Office of Grants and Research, the Charles E. Shannon Community Safety Initiative (Shannon) is modeled after the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention's Comprehensive Gang Model. Shannon is a multi-sector approach used to address a community's gang and youth violence problem. Each community receiving Shannon funding demonstrates the presence of risk factors for youth and gang violence. Shannon participants must be between the ages of 10-24 years.

FUNDING ALLOCATION



411 YOUTH SERVED

36% LOW-RISK* Youth in danger of engaging in risky behavior or gang activity due to the presence of known risk factors such as exposure to gang affiliates in their home or community.

34% **MODERATE-RISK*** Youth exposed to the same risk factors as low-risk youth, as well as additional risk factors such as school failure, dropping out, truancy, substance abuse, and gang involvement.

30% **HIGH-RISK*** Youth who are perpetrators or victims of shooting or stabbing violence, and/or are known gang members.

Gang Activity in Fall River

24 **Street Gangs**

850 **Qualified Gang Members**

In 2019, the Fall River Police Department interacted with members of 24 street gangs. Conflict between gangs is generally attributed to narcotic sales or the belief that disrespect has occurred from one gang to the other. The conflict escalates into violent confrontations, revenge shootings, stabbings, home invasions, robberies, beatings, random attacks, spray painting, and possession of firearms. They have been known to engage in sex trafficking or form sex trafficking rings, which encompasses prostitution. Illegal gambling has become an issue. Drug and fire arm trafficking continues to be the two primary criminal activities that gang members profit from.

MASSACHUSETTS SIMPLE ASSAULT


Simple assault arrests declined by 12.7% since 2015 (563 arrests)

MASSACHUSETTS AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Aggravated assault arrests declined by 20.6% since 2015 (391 arrests)

MASSACHUSETTS ROBBERY

Robbery arrests increased by 10.1% since 2015 (30 arrests)



FALL RIVER SIMPLE ASSAULT

Simple assault arrests declined by 29.3% since 2015 (76 arrests)



Aggravated assault arrests declined by 42.4% since 2015 (42 arrests)



Robbery arrests declined by 50% since 2015 (11 arrests)
