

Funded by the Executive Office of Public Safety and Security's Office of Grants and Research, the Charles E. Shannon Community Safety Initiative (Shannon) is modeled after the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention's Comprehensive Gang Model. Shannon is a multi-sector approach used to address a community's gang and youth violence problem. Each community receiving Shannon funding demonstrates the presence of risk factors for youth and gang violence. Shannon participants must be between the ages of 10-24 years.



Gang Activity in Lynn

10 Street Gangs

240 Approx. number of Gang Members Under 25 The LPD Gang Unit continues to monitor the activities of over 10 different gangs that operate in the City with an estimated 250-300 members and associates, about 80% of whom are under age 25. The more active gangs in Lynn include the Trinitarios, Tiny Rascal Gang (TRG), 9 Trey Gangsta Bloods, Deuce Boyz, Bloods, Little Crip Gang (LCG), and Vinny Caruso's. The city has experienced a large uptick in gang violence and shooting incidents, most notably between two feuding gangs, the *Trinitarios* and the Tiny Rascals Gang (TRG). These two gangs alone have been responsible for at least 21 reported shooting incidents resulting in 14 persons being shot this year. For 2019, LPD responded to 68 shots fired incidents with 30 of them confirmed gang related. The number of gang related firearm incidents has increased 66% from 2018 totals.
