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Significant Drought Affecting Riverfront Area and Pond Observations for Purposes of the Massachusetts Wetlands Protection Regulation July 13, 2020

On July 10th, 2020, Secretary Theoharides declared a continuation of Level 2 – Significant Drought in the Western, Connecticut River Valley, and Central EEA Drought Regions; a Level 1 – Mild Drought in the Northeast and Cape Cod EEA Drought Regions; and Normal conditions in the Southeast and Islands EEA Drought Regions. Note that the EEA Drought Regions do not coincide with the MassDEP Regional Office Boundaries.

Wetlands Protection Act Regulations:

For the Western, Connecticut River Valley, Central, and Northeast EEA Drought Regions: For any Notices of Intent (NOI) or Abbreviated Notices of Resource Area Delineation (ANRAD) filed on or after **June 24, 2020**, observation of rivers that have ceased flowing made on **May 1, 2020** and thereafter, may not be used to prove a perennial river is an intermittent stream with no Riverfront Area since drought conditions exist.

For the Cape Cod EEA Drought Region: For any Notices of Intent (NOI) or Abbreviated Notices of Resource Area Delineation (ANRAD) filed on or after **July 10, 2020**, observation of rivers that have ceased flowing made on **June 1, 2020** and thereafter, may not be used to prove a perennial river is an intermittent stream with no Riverfront Area since drought conditions exist.

Explanation: The Wetland Protection regulations at 310 CMR 10.58(2)(a)1.f. define drought as a period determined by the Massachusetts Drought Management Task Force, as established by the Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs, to be at the "Advisory" or more severe drought level. The "Level 1 – Mild Drought" designation replaces the "Advisory" level drought, which is specified at 310 CMR 10.04 (Definition of Pond) and 310 CMR 10.58(2)(a)1.f. (Riverfront Area). Drought for purposes of the Riverfront Area and Pond Observations will remain in effect until such time as the Secretary issues a written statement declaring that water resource conditions have returned to normal, ending the drought. The written statement declaring the drought over will be posted at the Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs web site.
