*Injuries* are the leading cause of death among Massachusetts children ages 1-17. In 2022, there were 70 injury-related deaths<sup>1</sup> among Massachusetts children ages 0-17, a rate of 5.5 per 100,000 children. The leading causes of injury deaths among Massachusetts children were poisonings, motor vehicle traffic injuries, suffocations/hangings, and drownings.
