Review and Vote on May 5, 2023, Meeting Minutes

Outcome

□ Chair moved for a vote and Committee members unanimously agreed to adopt the May 5, 2023, meeting minutes (Deborah Dreyfus and Rosalie Edes abstained due to absence)

Discussion

□ RRC discussed that the proposal has similar problems as a previously discussed proposal

Issues

□ Similar issues as a proposal considered earlier, nature and applicability of "research"

Outcome

□ Chair moved, and RRC members unanimously agreed, that proposed study does not meet the regulatory definition of research and falls outside of the purview of the RRC

Discussion

- □ RRC discussed that the proposal studies employees rather than individuals in DDS care, and the resulting applicability of RRC authority over the proposal
- □ RRC discussed different ways researchers can provide notice to individuals living in homes being studied and ensuring that those individuals' expectation of privacy is respected

Issues

- □ Members questioned if proposal falls under RRC purview, due to the subjects of the study being provider employees
- □ Ensuring individual privacy during virtual training sessions, preventing incidental/inadvertent recordings of individuals in provider care
- □ Proposal does not address what is the proposed communication to individuals in provider care to ensure awareness that there is research occurring in their homes
- □ Differing proposed controls between individual virtual training and group trainings pose different privacy concerns

Outcome

□ Chair moved, and RRC members unanimously agreed, that proposed study be approved conditional on receipt of satisfactory assurances on the protection of individuals' privacy and awareness of research being conducted; as well as how they will act to ensure the protection of individuals' privacy
