FY 2025 Local Election Early Voting Cost Certification Survey Information

- Covers vote-by-mail and inperson early voting expenses for non-coinciding local elections held July 1, 2024, through June 30, 2025
- Covers early voting expenses
 exclusive to local elections
 coinciding with Fall 2024 state
 elections and FY 2025 special
 state elections

Estimated Launch Date: April 2025

Deadlines for Survey Submissions

• For completed local elections:

- 2 weeks after survey launch
- For local elections after survey launch through April 30, 2025:
 - 2 weeks after scheduled election
- For May 2025 local elections:
 - 1 week after scheduled election

• For June 2025 elections:

Note on Local Elections Held Concurrently with Fall 2024 State Elections

- Only report expenses that are exclusively attributable to your local election in this survey
 - E.g., production and postage costs for local ballots

Note on Ballot Production Expenses

- The costs of producing and mailing early voting ballots for local elections will be certified to the extent the costs are not allocable to absentee ballots.
- Municipalities will be asked to allocate local election ballot production costs between early voting and absentee ballots.

 Costs to produce vote-by-mail applications are not eligible for
 certification.

In-Person Early Voting Expenses for Local Elections

- Generally, in-person early voting for non-coinciding local elections is **not mandated**.
- However, DLM will certify certain inperson early voting expenses for non-coinciding local elections during a municipality's regular business hours based on current budget language if in-person early voting was authorized by vote of the municipality.
