Whereas, The Commonwealth of Massachusetts recognizes September as Deaf Awareness Month in alignment with national observances to honor and celebrate the Deaf and Hard of Hearing community; and

Whereas, Massachusetts is committed to advancing accessibility, inclusion and equal opportunity for Deaf and Hard of Hearing individuals in education, employment, healthcare and public services,
