I am writing to inform you of a recent incident involving your Steppingstone, Inc. email account that may have affected the confidentiality of your personal information.

On May 27, 2026, Steppingstone, Inc. became aware that your agency email account had been compromised by an unauthorized individual. Upon investigating the incident, we determined that your email account contained an email that you had previously sent which included your personal information. Because the unauthorized individual may have had access to your email account during the period of the compromise, we cannot rule out the possibility that this information was accessed.

The information that may have been involved includes:

- Name
- Date of birth
- Driver's license number

Upon discovering the incident, we immediately secured your email account, initiated an investigation, and assessed the scope of the potential exposure. At this time, we have no evidence that your personal information has been misused or that identity theft has occurred. However, we are providing this notification out of an abundance of caution.

Steps You Can Take to Protect Your Information

We encourage you to remain vigilant by reviewing your personal records and monitoring for any suspicious activity. If you believe you are the victim of identity theft or fraud, you have the right to obtain a police report.

You also have the right to place a security freeze on your credit reports. A security freeze restricts access to your credit report and may help prevent someone from opening new accounts in your name. There is no fee to place, temporarily lift, or permanently remove a security freeze.
