Notice of Data Breach

Dear <<Full Name>>,

Tecan Technology Development Boston, Inc. (formerly known as Emphysys, Inc.) ("T-TDB") is writing to inform you of a data security incident that involved your personal information. T-TDB is committed to protecting your personal information, which is why we are writing to explain what happened, what information was involved, our response, and resources available to further protect your personal information.

WHAT HAPPENED?

On December 2, 2025, T-TDB, located in Woburn, Massachusetts, detected a cybersecurity incident impacting its systems at that location. Upon learning of the incident, we took immediate action to secure the environment and launched an investigation with the assistance of third-party forensic specialists to determine the nature and scope of the unauthorized access. We also gave notice to the FBI office that is investigating the actor responsible for this incident.

After completing our investigation, T-TDB determined that certain information maintained on its systems was accessed by the unauthorized actor between December 1 and 2, 2025. With the support of third-party specialists, we then began a review of the data and individuals affected. On January 27, 2026, T-TDB concluded its review of impacted data and determined that your personal information was involved.

WHAT INFORMATION WAS INVOLVED?

The types of information involved include your first and last name, in combination with your <<Data Elements>>. Although T-TDB has no evidence of misuse of the information involved in this incident, this notice includes steps you can take to further protect your personal information.

WHAT WE ARE DOING.

T-TDB has taken the steps necessary to address the incident and is committed to protecting the information you have entrusted to us. Immediately upon detecting this incident, T-TDB took steps to secure its environment from further risk, began remediation and recovery efforts, and launched a thorough investigation in partnership with third-party cybersecurity specialists. T-TDB continues to work with law enforcement who are conducting an active investigation into the unauthorized actor responsible for this incident. T-TDB also implemented additional technical safeguards to further enhance the security of information in its possession and to help prevent similar events from happening in the future.

In addition, T-TDB is offering you a complimentary 24-month membership of Privacy ID Solutions – 3 Bureau credit monitoring and identity protection services by Epiq eDiscovery Solutions, Inc. Steps to enroll in this service are detailed below. This service helps detect possible misuse of your personal information, provides you with identity protection support and helps with resolution of identity theft. Its services include credit reports, credit monitoring, and identity restoration support.

To enroll in Epiq’s Privacy ID Solutions - 3B Credit Monitoring, follow these instructions:

- 1) Visit www.privacysolutionsid.com and click “Activate Account”
- 2) Enter the following activation code, <<Activation Code>> and complete the enrollment form
- 3) Complete the identity verification process
- 4) You will receive a separate email from noreply@privacysolutions.com confirming your account has been set up successfully and will include an Access Your Account link in the body of the email that will direct you to the log-in page
- 5) Enter your log-in credentials
You will be directed to your dashboard and activation is complete!

The deadline to enroll is <<Enrollment Deadline>>. After <<Enrollment Deadline>>, the enrollment process will close, and your Epiq’s Privacy ID Solutions - 3B Credit Monitoring code will no longer be active. If you do not enroll by <<Enrollment Deadline>>, you will not be able to take advantage of Epiq’s Privacy ID Solutions - 3B Credit Monitoring, so please enroll before the deadline.

Steps You Can Take to Protect Against Identity Theft and Fraud

Order Credit Report

We encourage you to remain vigilant against incidents of identity theft and fraud, to review your account statements, and to monitor your credit reports for suspicious activity. Under U.S. law you are entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus. To order your free credit report, visit www.annualcreditreport.com or call, toll-free, 1-877-322-8228. You may also contact the three major credit bureaus directly to request a free copy of your credit report.

Place A Fraud Alert

At no charge, you can also have these credit bureaus place a “fraud alert” on your file that alerts creditors to take additional steps to verify your identity prior to granting credit in your name. Note, however, that because it tells creditors to follow certain procedures to protect you, it may also delay your ability to obtain credit while the agency verifies your identity. As soon as one credit bureau confirms your fraud alert, the others are notified to place fraud alerts on your file. Should you wish to place a fraud alert, or should you have any questions regarding your credit report, please contact any one of the agencies listed below.

It is necessary to contact only ONE of these bureaus and use only ONE of these methods. As soon as one of the three bureaus confirms your fraud alert, the others are notified to place alerts on their records as well. You will receive confirmation letters in the mail and will then be able to order all three credit reports, free of charge, for your review. An initial fraud alert will last for one year.

Place A Security Freeze

You may also place a security freeze on your credit reports. A security freeze prohibits a credit bureau from releasing any information from a consumer’s credit report without the consumer’s written authorization. However, please be advised that placing a security freeze on your credit report may delay, interfere with, or prevent the timely approval of any requests you make for new loans, credit mortgages, employment, housing, or other services. Under federal law, you cannot be charged to place, lift, or remove a security freeze. You will need to place a security freeze separately with each of the three major credit bureaus listed above if you wish to place a freeze on all your credit files. To request a security freeze, you will need to provide some or all the following information to the credit reporting agency, depending on whether you do so online, by phone, or by mail:

1. Your full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., II, III, etc.)
2. Social Security Number
3. Date of Birth
4. If you have moved in the past five (5) years, the addresses where you have lived over the prior five years
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility bill, telephone bill, rental agreement, or deed
6. A legible photocopy of a government issued identification card (state driver's license or ID card, military identification, etc.)
7. Social Security Card, pay stub, or W2
8. If you are a victim of identity theft, include a copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft.

The credit reporting agencies have one (1) to three (3) business days after receiving your request to place a security freeze on your credit report, based upon the method of your request. The credit bureaus must also send written confirmation to you within five (5) business days and provide you with a unique personal identification number (PIN) or password (or both) that can be used by you to authorize the removal or lifting of the security freeze. It is important to maintain this PIN/password in a secure place, as you will need it to lift or remove the security freeze.

To lift the security freeze to allow a specific entity or individual access to your credit report, you must make a request to each of the credit reporting agencies by mail, via their website, or by phone (using the contact information above). You must provide proper identification (including name, address, and social security number) and the PIN number or password provided to you when you placed the security freeze, as well as the identities of those entities or individuals you would like to receive your credit report. You may also temporarily lift a security freeze for a specified period rather than for a specific entity or individual, using the same contact information above. The credit bureaus have between one (1) hour (for requests made online) and three (3) business days (for request made by mail) after receiving your request to lift the security freeze for those identified entities or for the specified period.

You should also know that you have the right to file a police report if you ever experience identity fraud. Please note that to file a crime report or incident report with law enforcement for identity theft, you will likely need to provide some kind of proof that you have been a victim. A police report is often required to dispute fraudulent items. You can report suspected incidents of identity theft to local law enforcement, your state Attorney General, or the Federal Trade Commission. This notice has not been delayed by law enforcement.
