We're writing to let you know about a recent email security issue involving Idomeneo Enterprises, Inc. Based on a careful review of the email account, we determined that some emails, which contained your name and Social Security number, were present in the impacted account. There is no indication at this time that your information has been used for identity theft or fraud.

As a precaution, we've taken steps to strengthen our email security and are offering you complimentary credit monitoring and identity protection services for 24 months through IDX. Enrollment instructions are included with this letter if you choose to take advantage of the service.

We also recommend continuing your normal review of financial statements and credit reports, as you would in any situation involving personal information.

## Steps You Can Take to Help Protect Your Information

We're sharing the information below so you're aware of options available to you. These steps are precautionary, and you may decide which—if any—make sense for your situation.

### 1. Consider Enrolling in the Complimentary Monitoring Service

We are offering you free credit monitoring and identity protection services through IDX for 24 months. These services typically include alerts if certain changes are detected on your credit file.

If you would like to enroll, please follow the instructions included with this notice. Enrollment is optional.

- 1. Website and Enrollment.** Scan the QR image or go to <https://app.idx.us/account-creation/protect> and follow the instructions for enrollment using your Enrollment Code provided at the top of the letter. Please note the deadline to enroll is May 24, 2026.
- 2. Activate the credit monitoring** provided as part of your IDX identity protection membership. The monitoring included in the membership must be activated to be effective. Note: You must have established credit and access to a computer and the internet to use this service. If you need assistance, IDX will be able to assist you.
- 3. Telephone.** Contact IDX at 1-833-788-9712 to gain additional information about this event and speak with knowledgeable representatives about the appropriate steps to take to protect your credit identity.

### 2. Review Your Financial Accounts Periodically

As a general best practice, you may wish to continue reviewing bank statements, credit card statements, and other financial accounts for any activity you don't recognize. If something looks unusual, contact the financial institution directly.

### 3. Check Your Credit Reports

Under U.S. law, you are entitled to one free credit report every 12 months from each of the three major credit reporting bureaus. You can request these reports at:

- Contact the three major credit reporting bureaus directly using the contact information in the chart below.

Reviewing your credit report can help you confirm that no new accounts have been opened in your name without your knowledge.

### 4. Optional: Fraud Alerts or Credit Freezes

You may choose to place a fraud alert or credit freeze on your credit file. These tools are available at no cost and are entirely optional.

- A **fraud alert** notifies lenders to take extra steps to verify your identity before approving credit.
- A **credit freeze** restricts access to your credit report unless you approve it.

These options can be helpful for some individuals, but they may also slow down future credit applications. Whether to use them is a personal decision.

Please note that if you request a credit freeze, you may be required to provide the following information:

1. Full name (including middle initial as well as Jr., Sr., II, III, etc.);
2. Social Security number;

3. Date of birth;
4. Addresses for the prior two to five years;
5. Proof of current address, such as a current utility bill or telephone bill;
6. A legible photocopy of a government-issued identification card (state driver's license or ID card, etc.); and
7. A copy of either the police report, investigative report, or complaint to a law enforcement agency concerning identity theft if they are a victim of identity theft.
