Dear [Employee Name],

On or about March 19, 2026, IntelXual Software LLC (“IntelXual” or the “Company”) experienced a ransomware attack that affected certain servers of the Company. Because employee and former employee records were stored on the affected servers, it is possible that your personal information may have been subject to unauthorized access. At this time, it is unclear what employee information, if any, was actually acquired by the unauthorized actor. The types of personal information that may have been subject to unauthorized access and acquisition include your Social Security number, driver’s license number, and/or other personal identifying information.

IntelXual regrets that this incident occurred. Upon discovering the incident, the Company immediately took steps to protect personal information from further unauthorized access, including containment of the affected systems and disabling of the unauthorized access; implementation of enhanced security measures including strengthening of the firewall and intrusion detection systems; and a review of the existing security policies and procedures. The Company continues to evaluate and implement additional safeguards to help prevent a similar incident from occurring in the future.

We advise you to remain vigilant by reviewing your account statements and monitoring your credit reports for any suspicious activity. Under federal law, you are entitled to one free credit report annually from each of the three major nationwide consumer reporting agencies. In addition to the free annual credit reports available under federal law, IntelXual is offering you complimentary identity theft prevention services and credit monitoring at no cost to you for a period of two years through a company named Aura. You have the right to place a security freeze (also known as a credit freeze) on your credit report. A security freeze prohibits a consumer reporting agency from releasing information from your credit report without your express authorization. There is no charge for placing, temporarily lifting, or removing a security freeze. You may place a security freeze by contacting the three major consumer reporting agencies at the numbers and addresses listed below.

You may contact the three major consumer reporting agencies directly to place a fraud alert or security freeze on your credit file. If you believe you are the victim of identity theft or have reason to believe your personal information has been misused, you should contact your local police as well as the Federal Trade Commission and/or the Attorney General's office in your home state.
