The privacy and security of the personal information that Superior Drywall, Inc. (“Superior Drywall”) maintains is of the utmost importance. As such, we want to provide you with information about a recent data security incident, tell you about the services that we are providing to you, and let you know that we continue to take significant measures to protect your information.

Upon learning of this, we immediately secured our network and commenced an investigation. As part of our investigation, we have been working closely with external cybersecurity professionals experienced in handling these types of incidents. After this investigation and a subsequent document review, on May 22, 2026, we determined that between January 9-12, 2026, a limited amount of your personal information may have been subject to unauthorized acquisition. The information potentially impacted includes your name and: <<Breached Elements>>.

While we have no evidence of financial fraud or identity theft related to this data, we want to make you aware of the incident. Out of an abundance of caution, and to protect you from potential misuse of your information, we are offering a complimentary 24 month access to Experian IdentityWorks<sup>SM</sup>. This product helps detect possible misuse of your personal information and provides you with identity protection services focused on identification and resolution of identity theft. Experian IdentityWorks<sup>SM</sup> is completely free to you and enrolling will not hurt your credit score. For more information on identity theft prevention and Experian IdentityWorks<sup>SM</sup>, including instructions on how to access these services, please see the additional information provided in this letter.

This letter also provides additional precautionary measures you can take to protect your personal information, including placing a fraud alert and/or security freeze on your credit files, and/or obtaining a free credit report. Additionally, you should always remain vigilant in reviewing your financial account statements and credit reports for fraudulent or irregular activity on a regular basis.

Superior Drywall is committed to maintaining the privacy of personal information in our possession and has taken many precautions to safeguard it. We also continually evaluate and modify our practices and internal controls to enhance the security and privacy of your personal information.

**2. Obtaining a Free Credit Report**

Under federal law, you are entitled to one (1) free credit report every twelve (12) months from each of the above three (3) major nationwide credit reporting companies. Call **1-877-322-8228** or request your free credit reports online at [www.annualcreditreport.com](http://www.annualcreditreport.com). Once you receive your credit reports, review them for discrepancies. Identify any accounts you did not open or inquiries from creditors that you did not authorize. Verify all information is correct. If you have questions or notice incorrect information, contact the credit reporting company.

**3. Placing a Fraud Alert on Your Credit File.**

We recommend that you place an initial 1-year “fraud alert” on your credit files, at no charge. An initial fraud alert is free and will stay on your credit file for at least twelve months. The alert informs creditors of possible fraudulent activity within your report and requests that the creditor contact you before establishing any accounts in your name. To place a fraud alert, call any one of the three major credit bureaus at the numbers listed below. As soon as one credit bureau confirms your fraud alert, they will notify the others. **4. Placing a Security Freeze on Your Credit File.**

If you are very concerned about becoming a victim of fraud or identity theft, you may request a “Security Freeze” be placed on your credit file, at no charge. A security freeze prohibits, with certain specific exceptions, the consumer reporting agencies from releasing your credit report or any information from it without your express authorization. You may place a security freeze on your credit report by contacting all three nationwide credit reporting companies at the numbers below and following the stated directions or by sending a request in writing, by mail, to all three credit reporting companies:

In order to place the security freeze, you will need to supply your name, address, date of birth, Social Security number and other personal information. After receiving your freeze request, each credit reporting company will send you a confirmation letter containing a unique PIN (personal identification number) or password. Keep the PIN or password in a safe place. You will need it if you choose to lift the freeze. If your personal information has been used to file a false tax return, to open an account or to attempt to open an account in your name or to commit fraud or other crimes against you, you may file a police report in the city in which you currently reside.

If you do place a security freeze prior to enrolling in the credit monitoring service as described above, you will need to remove the freeze in order to sign up for the credit monitoring service. After you sign up for the credit monitoring service, you may refreeze your credit file.

**5. Additional Helpful Resources.**

Even if you do not find any suspicious activity on your initial credit reports, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) recommends that you check your credit reports periodically. Checking your credit report periodically can help you spot problems and address them quickly.

If you find suspicious activity on your credit reports or have reason to believe your information is being misused, call your local law enforcement agency and file a police report. Be sure to obtain a copy of the police report, as many creditors will want the information it contains to absolve you of the fraudulent debts. You may also file a complaint with the FTC by contacting them on the web at [www.ftc.gov/idtheft](http://www.ftc.gov/idtheft), by phone at 1-877-IDTHEFT (1-877-438-4338), or by mail at Federal Trade Commission, Consumer Response Center, 600 Pennsylvania Avenue, NW, Washington, DC 20580. Your complaint will be added to the FTC’s Identity Theft Data Clearinghouse, where it will be accessible to law enforcement for their investigations. In addition, you may obtain information from the FTC about fraud alerts and security freezes.

**Massachusetts Residents:** Under Massachusetts law, you have the right to obtain a police report in regard to this incident. If you are the victim of identity theft, you also have the right to file a police report and obtain a copy of it.
