Dear Ms. Cottrell:

On January 21, 2004, AT&T Communications of New England, Inc. ("AT&T") filed a motion to compel Verizon Massachusetts ("Verizon") to respond to several information requests from AT&T. Yesterday I wrote to you to inform the Department that, as a result of discussions between AT&T and Verizon, AT&T was withdrawing its motion to compel with respect to certain information requests (ATT-VZ-2, -5, -24, -25, -26, -27, -28, -31, -50, -58 and -131) because Verizon had indicated it would provide responsive answers to them.

Today I write to inform the Department of a new development. This morning, Verizon indicated that it will not provide an answer to ATT-VZ-131 and that its objection to that question remains. Hence, AT&T renews its motion to compel Verizon to respond to ATT-VZ-131.

To be clear, AT&T's Motion to Compel Verizon Responses to AT&T Information Requests, filed January 21, 2004, seeks to compel Verizon responses to ATT-VZ-131, -132, and -133.
