North Reading	Development of a DEIR to address water supply and wastewater issues. North Reading is located in the Ipswich River basin. A possible source of water supply being considered is the MWRA, which has sources in the Chicopee and Nashua River basins	A Stakeholder meeting was held on September 18, 2014.
