Wastewater: Regulatory Review

- Stakeholders request to review:
 - Title 5 regulations (310 CMR 15.00) and
 - Groundwater Discharge Permitting regulations (314 CMR 5.00)
- Interested Stakeholder Groups:
 - Home Builders
 - Commercial Developers
 - Seasonal Campgrounds
 - Watershed Groups
- MassDEP to convene external stakeholder group

Wastewater: Regulatory Review

- Title 5 (310 CMR 15.00)
- Design flows for residential facilities
 - Effect of low flow fixtures on water use
 - Use of holding tanks for peak flows
 - Reductions in groundwater separation requirements for new construction using alternative technologies
 - Uniform statewide Title 5 Code
- Title 5 (310 CMR 15.00) and Groundwater Discharge (314 CMR 5.00)
- Flow threshold for groundwater discharge permit
 - New category of large systems (7,500-30,000)

NPDES Delegation




- Early stages of pursuing NPDES delegation
- Strong track record in administering other federally delegated programs
- Improved understanding of water quality through enhanced water quality monitoring and assessment program
- Opportunity to more closely engage with communities and other permittees
- Increased flexibility for use of Integrated Water Management

MS4 Implementation and Major Deadlines

- Effective Date July 1, 2017
- Notice of Intent (NOIs) September 29, 2017
- Stormwater Management Plan June 30, 2018
- Illicit Discharge Detection and Elimination (IDDE)
 Plan December 31, 2018

MS4 Permit Appeal – Major Issues

- DC 1st Circuit consolidated 5 appeals
 - Conservation Law Foundation (CLF)
 - the National Association of Home Builders
 - o the city of Lowell, MA
 - Mass Coalition for Water Resources Stewardship and Town of Franklin
 - Center for Regulatory Reasonableness (CRR)
- Major challenge: MA MS4 recasts water quality standards as enforceable "effluent limitations" of the permit
 - Moving from a BMP-based program to WQ-based program



MassDEP MS4 Outreach & Technical Support




- Staff actively assisting the SW Coalitions
- Over \$200k in grants for technical training and outreach to the Coalitions
- Developing training program for 2017 with EPA to include NOI, IDDE, SW Mgmt Plan

Water Management Act Permitting

- Currently Permitting in:
 - South Coastal Basin
 - o Cape Cod Basin
- Permitting for the MetroWest Communities:
 - o 2017: Taunton and Boston Harbor Basins
 - o 2019: Concord Basin
 - o 2020: Merrimack
 - o Charles and Blackstone Basins were renewed in 2010
- Prior to permitting, DEP is scheduling one on one consultations





WMA Permit Allocations




- Some permits renewals begin in 2017.
- Existing permits are administratively continued.
- Water Needs Forecasts (WNF) are used to establish permit allocations.
- Most MetroWest communities see increasing use but their permitting status varies.
 - 11 have permits with allocations that appear sufficient to meet WNF
 - 11 have not had final WNF prepared
 - 3 have WNF > than current permit
