



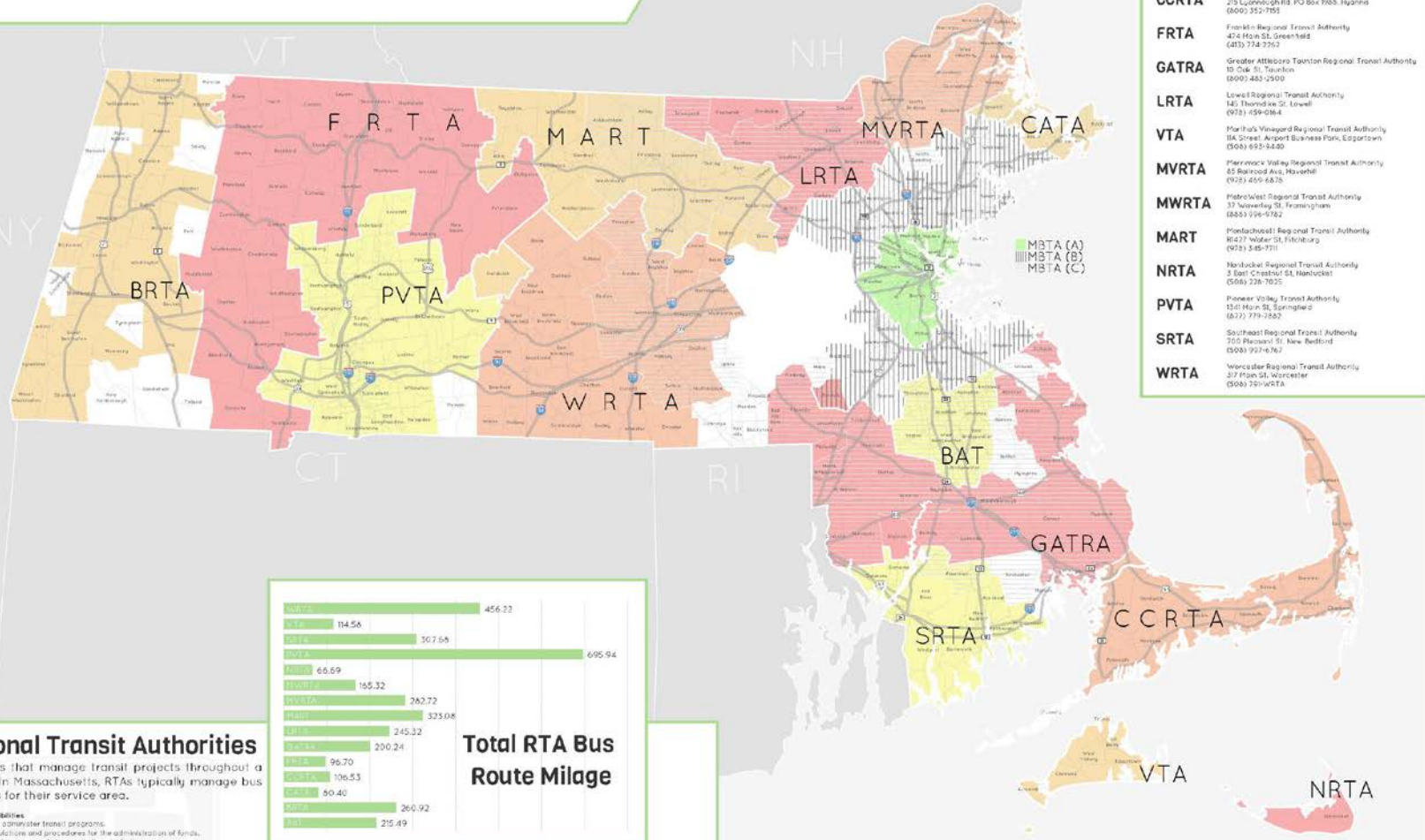

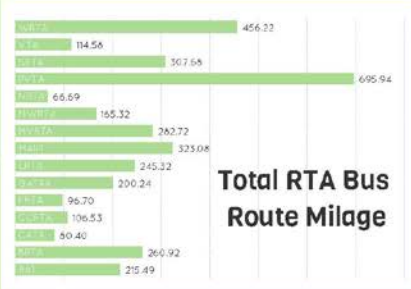

Regional Transit Authorities

Agencies that manage transit projects throughout a region. In Massachusetts, RTAs typically manage bus services for their service area.

- RTA Responsibilities:**
- Direct and administer transit programs.
 - Adopt regulations and procedures for the administration of funds.
 - Review and recommend changes in laws to further transportation financing, infrastructure and development.
 - Act as the central entity and coordinating organization for transportation initiatives.
 - Enter into agreements with authorities to improve efficiency and program effectiveness and to preserve fiscal resources, promote economy and efficiency, and leverage federal funding and private investment.
 - Develop and administer the long-term statewide transportation plan.
 - Administer the Massachusetts Transportation Trust Fund.

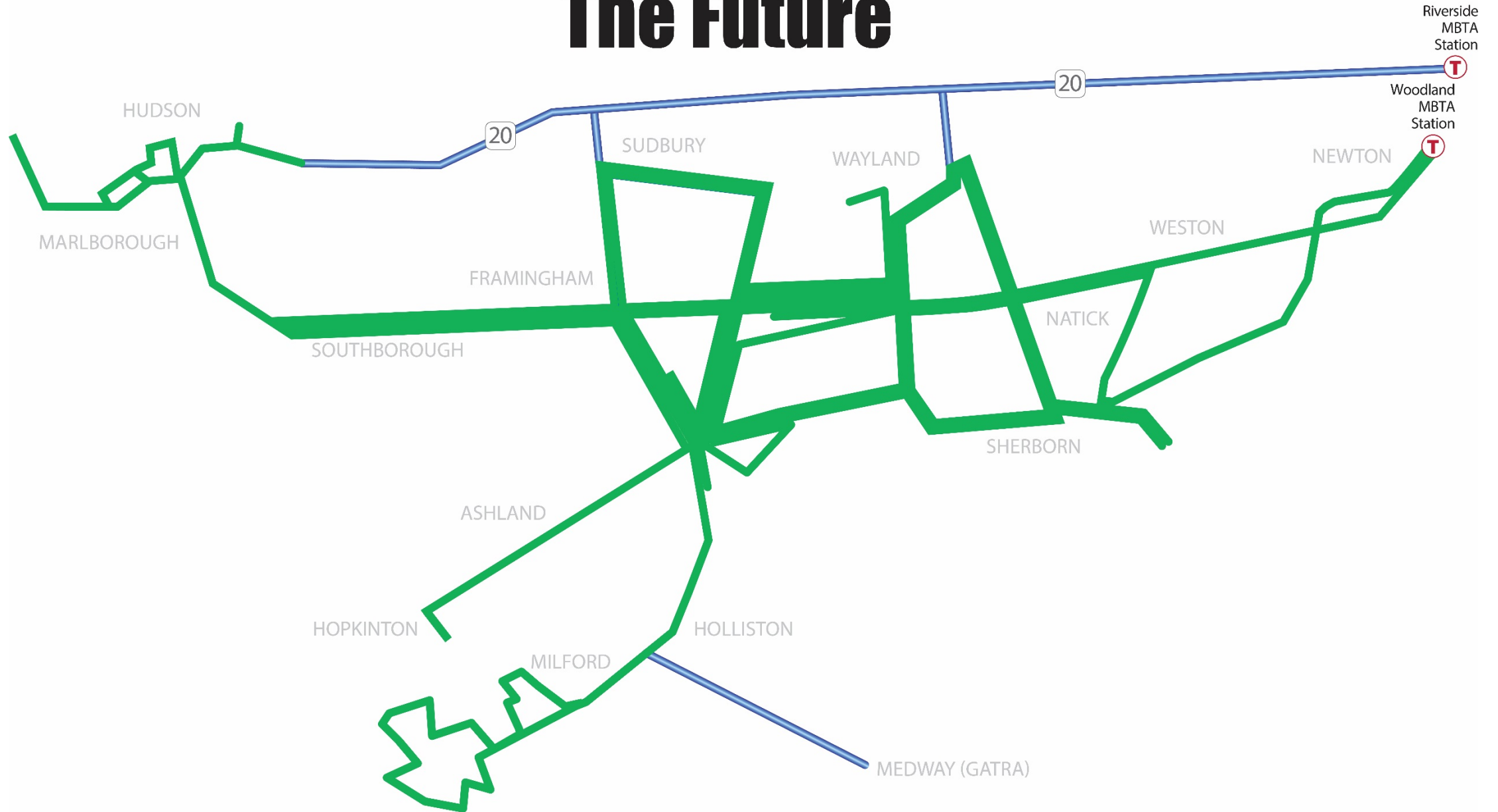
Current Existing MWRTA System



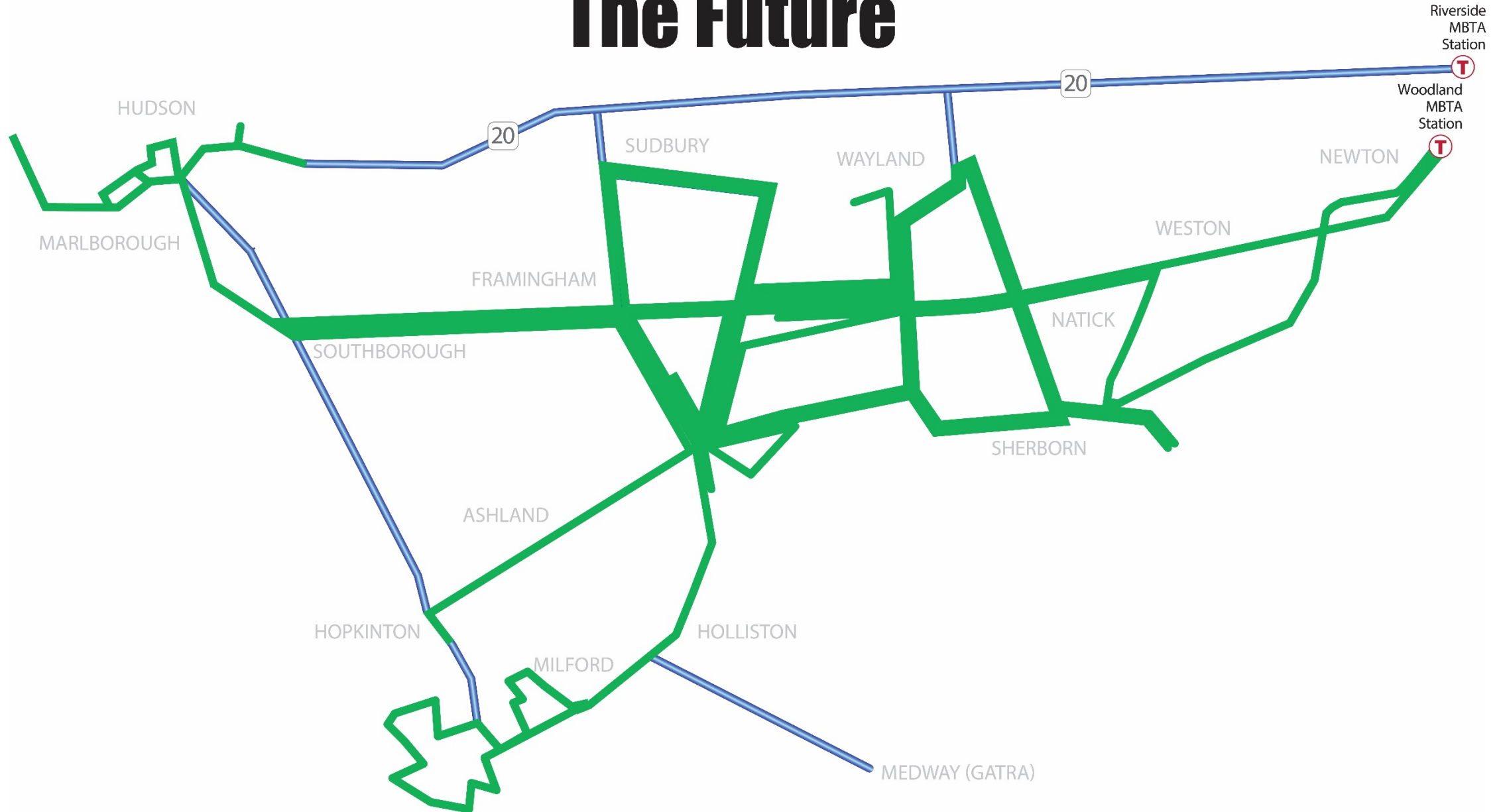
