Dear Ipswich, Rowley, and Newbury Selectboards:

The Division of Marine Fisheries has determined that bivalve shellfish, from area N4 defined below, do not contain biotoxins (Paralytic Shellfish Poison - (PSP)) from the phytoplankton *Alexandrium* (spp.) in excess of established standards. Area N4 remains closed to the harvesting of all carnivorous snails.

Therefore, under authority of Massachusetts General Laws, Chapter 130, section 74A, the PSP closure issued on June 13, 2025, will be **rescinded at sunrise on June 26, 2025**, in the growing area N4 "Plum Island Sound". Shellfish in areas currently classified as CONDTIONALLY APPROVED shall revert to the status dictated by the Conditional Area Management Plan. Bivalve shellfish may now be harvested for direct human consumption subject to local rules and regulations under authority of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 130, section 52. Areas classified as "PROHIBITED" shall remain closed to the harvest of shellfish for direct human consumption.

## STATUS: OPEN TO THE HARVEST OF SHELLFISH This area remains CLOSED to the harvesting of ocean quahogs and all carnivorous snails.
