Ladies and Gentlemen.

In accordance with Chapter 130, section 74A of the Massachusetts General Laws, the Division of Marine Fisheries has determined that the below defined shellfish areas in the Cities of Newburyport and Gloucester, and the Towns of Newbury, Rowley, Ipswich, and Rockport, closed on August 8, 2023, due to heavy rain, now meet the National Shellfish Sanitation Program guidelines for an "OPEN" status.

Therefore, under authority of MGL, Chapter 130, Sections 74A and 322 CMR 7.01 (7) the below-defined areas will revert to their former status prior to the closure on August 8, 2023, effective immediately, and open to the harvest of shellfish for direct human consumption subject to local rules and regulations under authority of MGL Chapter 130, section 52.

All previous bacterial closures remain in effect.

CLASSIFICATION: APPROVED Status: Open to Shellfishing

The waters, flats and tributaries in shellfish growing areas N3, N6, N8, N10, N11, N12, in the Cities of Gloucester and Newburyport, and the Towns of Ipswich, Newbury, Rockport, Rowley.
