> Re: <u>VHS Acquisition Subsidiary Number 9, Inc. (d/b/a MetroWest Medical Center) –</u> Formal 90-Day Notice of Closure of Inpatient Pediatric Service at Framingham <u>Union Campus</u>

Dear Attorney Lohnes:

We write on behalf of VHS Acquisition Subsidiary Number 9, Inc., d/b/a MetroWest Medical Center (the "Medical Center") in follow-up to the initial essential services closure notice that the Medical Center filed with the Department of Public Health (the "Department") and the appropriate parties required by the Department's regulations on July 29, 2020. Pursuant to 105 CMR 130.122(B), the Medical Center hereby provides formal ninety (90) day notice to the Department of its decision to discontinue its operation of inpatient pediatric services, consisting of 21 beds, ("the Service") at the Medical Center's, Framingham Union Campus located at 115 Lincoln Street, Framingham, MA 01702. We offer the following comments with respect to this matter.

Over the course of the last year, the Medical Center determined that the Service should be discontinued because of insufficient patient volume, which is an indicator that the patient population does not need the Service at the Medical Center. In compliance with applicable requirements at 105 CMR 130.122(B), the Medical Center provides this written notice of the planned discontinuance of the above described Service. The following information regarding the discontinuation is hereby provided for your review.

1. <u>Current Utilization Rates</u>. The following represents the inpatient volume of the Service at the Medical Center over the last several years, including year-to-date (YTD).

The Medical Center's inpatient pediatric unit has experienced a continued decline to less than onethird of the already low census in 2016. experienced zero pediatric inpatients at the Medical Center. This significantly low Average Daily Census and continued decline year over year is evidence that there is insufficient demand for the Service at the Medical Center.

2. <u>Impact of Discontinuance</u>. The Medical Center does not expect any negative impact on patient access following the closure of this Service. Pediatric coverage will still be provided in the emergency department, post-partum units, and outpatient clinic to meet the community need. Moreover, most of the pediatric patients presenting to the Medical Center that require an inpatient hospital stay involve severe illness warranting specialized care provided at a tertiary care facility.

3. <u>Date Set of Discontinuation</u>. Ninety (90) day notice is hereby given for a target closure date of November 27, 2020.
