Adolescent & Young Adult Services

Adolescent Outreach Program

The Adolescent Outreach Program is here to support youth or young adults to build the future they envision by offering individualized services and practical resources during their transition to independent life.

Services for youth ages 16-18 in foster care settings and from 18-23 in voluntary extended foster care:

- Obtaining employment and internships
- Developing housing plan
- Financial assistance with a variety of needs
- Youth Readiness Assessment Tool
- Independent living skills development
- Vocational training or college applications
- Budgeting and building credit
- Connecting with Mass Health support
- Building positive lifelong connections with responsible adults

Support for young adults who have aged out of foster care at 18:

- Assisting with FAFSA and ETV applications, completing college financial assistance and vocational training applications
- Help with accessing services and resources/aftercare

Young Adult Support Payments (YASP):

- Provided to young adults who are in compliance with their VPA and require monthly visits from their social worker.
- Living in a supervised independent living setting (i.e., college dorm, apartment, former foster home, or renting a space)

Life Skills Support Program

Provides funds for youth ages 14-23 in placement to support positive youth development and achieve their selfsufficiency goals. Youth can utilize funds for educational technology, drivers' education, senior expenses, interview attire, gym membership, etc.

Discharge Support Program

Provides financial and aftercare support to youth discharging from DCF placement at or after age 18, including funding toward first and last month's rent, security deposit, as well as support with budgeting, home management, and employment.

Hybrid Life Skills Training

(formerly PAYA – Preparing Adolescents for Young Adulthood) Life skills curriculum is now available online through Life Skills Reimagined to assist youth in care ages 14-22 with interactive learning about money management, personal care, job seeking, healthy relationships, housing, and other essential needs. Youth complete modules online, a worksheet with adult supporter, and received a \$75 stipend per module and an additional \$150 once all modules are completed.



College and Vocational Training Support

The Department provides financial assistance for youth in college or vocational schools that includes Tuition and Fee Waivers, Foster Child Grant, Education Training Vouchers, and the William Warren Scholarship Program.

Housing Support

DCF's Housing Coordinator supports youth in their transition to independent living and obtaining stable permanent housing. We provide housing consults, referrals to community housing providers/TAY FYI and YTTSP housing vouchers.
