

## Adult Vaccine Availability Table – Effective April 2026 –

**Eligibility:**

- The Vaccine Program provides a limited supply of vaccines for uninsured and underinsured<sup>1</sup> adults seen in public sector sites.<sup>2</sup> **Employees of public sector sites are not eligible for state-supplied vaccine.**
- The Vaccine Program **does not** provide vaccines for adults seen at private provider sites. Availability of vaccines may change during an outbreak.
- Sites with billing capacity should purchase vaccine and seek reimbursement from health insurers.

Hep B <sup>4</sup>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul> <p><u>Please Note:</u> Employers covered by federal OSHA regulations are responsible for supplying hepatitis B vaccine to their employees. State-supplied vaccine is <b>not</b> available for this group.</p>
HPV <sup>5</sup>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
Influenza	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
MenACWY <sup>4</sup>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
Meningococcal B (MenB)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
MMR <sup>4</sup>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
Mpox	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
Pneumococcal conjugate (PCV20, PCV21)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> <li>• <u>Please Note:</u> PCV20 and PCV21 are not interchangeable in all situations. <b>PCV21 can only be used for recommended adult groups (age 19 years and older)</b>, whereas PCV20 can be used for recommended groups of both children and adults.</li> </ul>
Pneumococcal Polysaccharide (PPSV23)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
Polio	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>

<b>RSV</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
<b>Tdap<sup>4, 5</sup></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
<b>Td</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
<b>Varicella<sup>5</sup></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites.<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>
<b>Zoster (Shingles) Vaccine<sup>5</sup></b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Only for uninsured or underinsured</b> adults in recommended groups<sup>3</sup> seen at public sites<sup>2</sup></li> </ul>

<sup>1</sup> **Underinsured:** A person who has health insurance, but the insurance does not cover the cost of any vaccines; a person whose insurance covers only selected vaccines; a person whose insurance does not provide first-dollar coverage for vaccines. First-dollar coverage includes copays, coinsurance and deductibles. Copays, coinsurance or deductibles will not apply for the administration of any ACIP or MDPH recommended vaccines.

<sup>2</sup> **Public Sector Sites include:**

- Local health departments
- Community health centers
- Free community-based clinics
- TB clinics
- Public hospitals
- Public Colleges
- Correctional facilities
- State Agencies
- Integrated Counseling Testing and Referral Sites
- Health care for the homeless

<sup>3</sup> **Recommended Groups:** Groups that are recommended for vaccines have been recommended for routine use either by the CDC's Advisory Committee for Immunization Practices or by the DPH Commissioner as outlined at: <https://www.mass.gov/info-details/dph-recommended-guidance-for-vaccines>
