#### Introduction to EPR Commission



- Established by Section 108 of Chapter 239 of the Acts of 2024
- The Commission's charge: "...recommend to the general court extended producer responsibility policies for the commonwealth"
- Including:
  - Recommendations on specific extended producer responsibility approaches and other strategies for paint, mattresses, electronics, lithium-ion batteries, plastics, and packaging
  - Proposed structures for collection, processing, and financial responsibility
  - Information on cost impacts
  - Waste reduction product and packaging incentives, and
  - Impacts on waste generation and contamination reduction
- Issue initial recommendations and related findings by January 15, 2026

## WHY PACKAGING EPR?

- Increased recycling costs coupled with never enough municipal funding underfunded.
- Municipal recycling stagnated ~32%
- Fragmented municipal recycling → inefficient
- Confusing recycling instructions/packaging labels
   Contamination
- Recycling markets fluctuated → municipal recycling contracts unstable






# **Current Recycling System**



# U.S. PACKAGING **EPR LAWS AND 2025 BILLS**



Existing Law(s) Introduced packaging EPR bill in 2025

Packaging EPR has been in place for 35+ years in Europe and 15+ years in Canada

2008: PSI webinars, conference panels, government strategy calls. Industry opposed.

**2010**: PSI packaging EPR model elements document – best practices.

**2010:** Beverage Assoc of VT introduced first pkg EPR bill in US; would remove deposit return system; fails.

**2010-2011:** US EPA multi-stakeholder national pkg dialogue ends w/data report, no agreement.



**Industry Voluntary Initiatives:** Funding & Commitments → PCR, reusable, recyclable etc.

Plastics pollution backlash and plastic bag bans

**2013 (Green Fence) and 2017 (China National Sword):** China restricts recycling imports

**2019-2020:** PSI and **Flexible Packaging Association** (FPA) dialogue.

- \* Agreement on 8 of 16 Key Elements
- \* **FPA** first packaging producer to support EPR.
- \* Other producers decline to meet.



# "ECO-MODULATED" PACKAGING FEES



Producer fees based on the material itself



Producer fees based on quantity of the material put on the market (reuse/refill - lower/no cost)



Producer fees based on **cost to the system** (how expensive is it to manage)



Producer fees based on **other environmental factors** (toxics, recycled content quantity, carbon impact, litter contribution)




## PACKAGING EPR ELEMENTS

**Covered Materials**: All packaging regardless of recyclability. Multiple programs also include paper products and packaging-like products.

**Covered Entities:** Single and multi-family residences, depots and transfer stations, public places.

**Producer or Responsible Party:** Party that has legal ownership of brand that uses covered materials

# PSI Packaging EPR Harmonization Task Force

**Goal:** Align core elements of packaging EPR laws across states to reduce complexity and improve outcomes.

#### Why It Matters:

- Creates confusion for producers
- Harmonization supports compliance and environmental goals

#### Who's Involved:

75+ stakeholders from government, industry, recycling, and nonprofits

#### **Next Steps:**

- 6 virtual meetings (Sept–Dec 2025)
- Focus on top-priority elements
