FY18 Omnibus Legislation: FAA Funding



- Extended FAA Reauthorization through Sep 30, 2018; Long-term bill still pending
 - > Funds the FAA at \$18B, \$1.6B higher than the FY2017 level
 - Airport Improvement Program (AIP) increased from \$3.35B to \$4.35B
 - \$1B in supplemental funding for "grants in aid" to airports
 - Funding available in FY2018-20 Discretionary grants emphasize non-primary and non-hub airports
- FAA share for additional funds 90% primary airports; 100% non-primary airports
 - FAA must obligate the \$1B by 9/30/2020 & pay out all obligations by 9/30/2025
- The supplemental appropriation will be phased
 - 1st round of AIP grants (in FY18) awarded to "priority consideration" airports
 - MA has five eligible airports including, Barnstable Municipal, Martha's Vineyard, Nantucket Memorial, New Bedford Regional, and Provincetown

FY18 Omnibus Legislation



- Omnibus established two deadlines as per Federal Register Notice
- Deadline #1 (for supplemental funding requests in FY 2018):
 - Included "priority consideration" airports, for projects where the planning, airspace, environmental, permitting & engineering design requirements were completed
 - Complied with NLT dates of Aug 8, 2018 for applications, and Sep 1, 2018 construction bids. Construction to begin within 6 months, or no later than Mar 1, 2019
- MA Airports submitted the following (pending) requests for Deadline #1:

(Deadline #1 includes primary airports with 90% federal, 5% state, and 5% local airport shares)

FY18 Omnibus Legislation



- Deadline #2 (for supplemental funding requests in FY2019 or FY2020):
- 2nd phase project funding available to any eligible airport listed in the National Plan of Integrated Airport Systems (NPIAS)
 - Airports not on FAA's "priority consideration" list must provide more detailed explanation outlining why the FAA should consider their project for funding
 - Airports to notify FAA by October 31, 2018 of the airport sponsor's desire to be considered for supplemental discretionary funding in FY19 or FY20
 - Airports must be able to accept a grant by September 1, 2020 or earlier, and be prepared to begin construction no later than March 1, 2021
- The Aeronautics Division will fulfill the same roles and responsibilities with respect to supplemental funding that it does with respect to other AIP funds

Aircraft Registration Program & Revenue

- Aircraft based in MA, or temporarily located in state for ≥ 60 days/year must register with MassDOT and the airport (manager) where aircraft is located
- Annual fees vary based on aircraft Max Certified Takeoff Weight (\$100-\$300/year)
- Renewal Forms sent in Oct; due Jan 1. Aircraft purchased >June 1st pro-rated
- FY18 registration program Streamlined the billing process with new Aircraft Registration & Billing IT System, and increased fee collection efforts.
 - The Division registered 1,883 aircraft and generated approximately \$322,000 in revenue for FY2018, a collection effort increase of 60% from FY2017
- Next step: Automate the program's billing process and enable electronic registration payments
 - > Will save the Division both time & money, and improve customer service
