This application form is to be completed by an entity that wishes to apply for a Certificate of Registration to operate a Registered Marijuana Dispensary ("RMD") in Massachusetts ("applicant").

If seeking a Certificate of Registration for more than one RMD, the applicant must submit a separate Application of Intent, all required attachments, and an application fee for each proposed RMD. Please identify each application of multiple applications by designating it as Application 1, 2 or 3 in the header of each application page. Please note that no executive, member, or any entity owned or controlled by such an executive or member, may directly or indirectly control more than three RMDs.

Unless indicated otherwise, all responses must be typed into the application forms. Handwritten responses will not be accepted. Please note that character limits include spaces.

Attachments should be labeled or marked so as to identify the question to which it relates.

Each submitted application must be a complete, collated response, printed single-sided on 8 ½" x 11" paper, and secured with a binder clip (no ring binders, spiral binding, staples, or folders).

REVIEW

Applications are reviewed in the order they are received.

After a completed application packet and fee is received by the Department of Public Health ("Department"), the Department will review the information and will contact the applicant if clarifications or updates to the submitted application materials are needed. The Department will notify the applicant whether it has met the standards necessary to be invited to submit a Management and Operations Profile.

If invited by the Department to submit a Management and Operations Profile, the applicant must submit the Management and Operations Profile within 45 days from the date of the invitation letter, or the applicant must submit a new Application of Intent and fee in order to proceed in the application process. Applicants must receive an invitation from the Department to submit a Siting Profile within 1 year of the date of submission of the Management and Operations Profile.

PROVISIONAL CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION

Applicants must receive a Provisional Certificate of Registration from the Department within 1 year of the date of the invitation letter from the Department to submit a *Siting Profile*. If the applicant does not meet this deadline, the application will be considered to have expired. Should the applicant wish to proceed with obtaining a Certificate of Registration, a new application must be submitted, beginning with an *Application of Intent*, together with the associated fee.

REGULATIONS

For complete information regarding registration of an RMD, please refer to 105 CMR 725.100, as well as materials posted on the Medical Use of Marijuana Program website: www.mass.gov/medicalmarijuana.



That the Town hereby accepts the provisions of Chapter 40, Sections 42A through 42F and Section 42I, of the General Laws to authorize the collection of water rates, as printed in the warrant.



Healthier World wishes to engage in the distribution of cannabis containing products ranging from plants to oils to edibles and apparatus for the treatment of pain management conditions in humans and in some cases animals. **Cannabis has a long history and recent legality** as a non-steroidal, pain managing therapeutic that has been available for hundreds of years but has only been made available for medical and recreational use in the state of Massachusetts recently and is a preferred and effective treatment for pain associated with cancer, fibromyalgia, sleep disorders, anxiety, Post Traumatic Stress Disorder, Parkinson's Disease, Epilepsy, Dravet's Syndrome and many more disorder without the severe side effects associated with steroid treatments and other conventional treatments.

Securing Healthier World's likelihood of success is the fact that the management team has successfully managed the production and distribution of animal over the counter pharmaceuticals remedies to treat animal skin disorders for over two decades. The most common therapy is steroids which can lead to long term side effects and even death. The safety and efficacy of the Company's flagship product, alpha1-antitrypsin (AAT) has clearly demonstrated efficacy worldwide and is well accepted and will be continued to be pursued and perhaps evolve into a companion therapy for cannabinoids.

AAT has demonstrated efficacy in many other lucrative therapeutic areas that cannabinoids share, but due to supply constraints have not been pursued. The Company can profit from and enter markets utilizing accessible cannabinoids in each of the listed disease areas with multi-tiered partnering opportunities. The Company has developed a clinical roll-out strategy, prioritizing their applications by those that present the quickest path to market. The targeted applications are those that are subject to the most important regulatory considerations, such as epilepsy, pain management and cancer.

In addition, The Company wishes to successfully introduce and proliferate CBD availability in the state of Massachusetts. CBD hemp oil has a huge range of potential health benefits and uses, including reducing pain, soothing <u>anxiety</u>, fighting <u>cancer</u>, improving mood, eliminating depression, preventing inflammatory arthritis, protecting the immune system, balancing the metabolism, aiding

<u>sleep</u> disorders, and <u>healing</u> the <u>skin</u>, among others. CBD oil can also be used in many different ways and has a variety of applications for natural health without the euphoric effects of its sister product THC.

Cannabis as a Treatment for Pain and other Conditions

Cannabis has positive effects on pain for a vast variety of human condition ranging from cancer to anxiety. Cannabinoids have a calming effect on the bodies' response to degranulation of mast cells which release trypsin, tryptase, chymase and histamine release factors. THC (as well as CBD) as pharmacologically effective components and have been proven effective and their impact has only been realized in the last decade.

Healthier World has invested in proprietary cultivation system of creating cannabis containing products that can be used safely and effectively. With more than \$1 Million invested over the last year of research and development, The Company has successfully planned for the developed and manufactured of cannabis containing products all within the guidelines established by the state of Massachusetts. It should be noted that Healthier World will only acquire products from properly licensed cultivators and manufacturers in the state of Massachusetts for medical use and adult use should the laws provide for a legal market place.

<u>A Natural Alternative</u> —Cannabis derivatives are an alternative to current pain treatment products like opioids and is a logical and medically supported preferred option. By offering a therapy without many of the severe side-effects associated with opioids the current opioid epidemic may be better controlled or eliminated.

Otitis Media/Externa — Cannabis has been proven a potent inhibitor of pain associated with Otitis Media in humans (Antonelli et al, 2005). The Company believes, therefore, that there is a strong market for rAAT in combination with cannabinoids for the treatment of OM. The Company has begun the FDA process with its FDA #010641 for otitis externa in animals.

Market Opportunities:

In 2017, it estimated that over \$12.75 billion will be spent on cannabis containing products worldwide.

Efficacy Data

Pain Management through cannabis has been the subject of increased study over the last two decades with over 400 human and animal studies demonstrating safety and efficacy. Below is a small summary of where cannabinoids may be applied.

- Wachter and Lezdey (1992) found beneficial effects of topical AAT in the treatment of atopic dermatitis (see Exhibit 4) and psoriasis in humans with pain management benefits.
- Chalker (1993) reported a successful human clinical trial utilizing pain management techniques to treat eczema and presented this information to the World Dermatologic Conference (Toronto, Canada, 1993).
- Berger et al. (1996) demonstrated beneficial effects in the treatment of cystic fibrosis and recommends cannabinoids over more evasive pain treatment methods.
- Forteza et al. (1996) reported positive results with cannabinoids in the treatment of asthma in both sheep models and humans

- Avidano et al. (1998) quantified the pain effects human patients suffering from otitis media (ear aches)
- Johnson & Johnson (1998) conducted successful clinical studies highlighting therapeutic benefits in pain associated with wound healing

RECENT FULL CASE STUDY Cannabis for chronic pain: case series and implications for clinicians. Ware MA¹, Gamsa A, Persson J, Fitzcharles MA.

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Abstract

BACKGROUND:

Chronic pain is one of the most common reasons for therapeutic cannabis use.

OBJECTIVES:

To describe therapeutic cannabis, use among patients with chronic pain.

METHODS:

Patients with chronic pain who voluntarily indicated that they used cannabis therapeutically completed a questionnaire about the type of cannabis used, the mode of administration, the amount used and the frequency of use, and their perception of the effectiveness of cannabis on a set of pain-associated symptoms and side effects. The study was approved by the McGill University Health Centre Research Ethics Board.

RESULTS:

Fifteen patients (10 male) were interviewed (median age 49.5 years, range 24 to 68 years). All patients smoked herbal cannabis for therapeutic reasons (median duration of use six years, range two weeks to 37 years). Seven patients only smoked at night-time (median dose eight puffs, range two to eight puffs), and eight patients used cannabis mainly during the day (median dose three

puffs, range two to eight puffs); the median frequency of use was four times per day (range one to 16 times per day). Twelve patients reported improvement in pain and mood, while 11 reported improvement in sleep. Eight patients reported a 'high'; six denied a 'high'. Tolerance to cannabis was not reported.

CONCLUSIONS:

The results of this self-selected case series must be interpreted with caution. Small doses of smoked cannabis may improve pain, mood and sleep in some patients with chronic pain. Clinical trials are warranted to test these effects. Further prospective studies should examine the patterns and prevalence of cannabis use among chronic pain populations.

To date, Mr. Lezdey has worked in the clinical area for The Company by assembling a team of scientist that created the world's first "human-like" AAT derived from yeast cells.

<u>VTU Sciences</u> - Consulting - Belgium based VTU's team of researchers led technology transfer, scale-up and manufacturing projects for large pharmaceutical companies such as Merck, Glaxo and others.
