Dear Nursing Colleagues,

On behalf of the more than 5,000 Registered Nurses serving in the Air Force as active duty, reserve, and guard Nurse Corps officers, I am writing to express my sincere appreciation for your support and recognition of our military service. I am also seeking your support to rescind options that allow military nurses to renew their registered nurse license for a reduced or waived fee.

Air Force guidance states that Nurse Corps officers "must possess and maintain an active, current, valid and unrestricted license from a U.S. jurisdiction before practicing independently within the defined scope of their specialty". A registered nurse license obtained by a military nurse at a reduced or waived rate compared to other nurses in that jurisdiction meets our definition of a restricted license. While unintended, reduced licensure fees limit the practice of military nurses and potentially impact the readiness of our medical force.
