Revision to MassHealth Breast and Cervical Cancer Treatment Program

Background

RE:

In December 2003, MassHealth issued All Provider Bulletin 129 and Transmittal Letter ALL-121, announcing the expansion of benefits to women diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer. At that time, the revisions to the member regulations allowed a woman who was not eligible for MassHealth Standard because of insufficient citizenship or immigration status to be eligible for MassHealth Limited.

MassHealth Limited

In late December 2003, after the member regulations had been filed with the Secretary of State, MassHealth was notified by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services that women diagnosed with breast or cervical cancer but who have insufficient citizenship or immigration status, will not be eligible for MassHealth Limited.
